Lancers to Face Hawks Friday Night

The Kuemper Knights defused Ar-We-Va's Rockets in the second game of a doubleheader at Carroll Stadium last night. The 12-2 game put the Knights opposite the Manilla Hawks in the second half of Friday nights twin bill. Lou Billmeier will probably get the nod to go on the hill.

The Lancers used a pair of pitchers, Dave Staier and Rick Keat, to sew up the win in the encounter halted by the ten-run rule.

Staier, the Charger strong righthander, worked the first three innings. He faced the minimum number of nine and whiffed seven. One out was an infield popup and the Knight pitcher threw out another on a routine play.

Keat saw his first pitching action of the season. He allowed one hit and two runs in his two inning stint.

Kuemper used their superior speed to advantage in the initial frame. Dave Schmitz and Kent Casey singled with the latter scoring second to put men in scoring position. Ernie Golwitzer lined to the short stop. The two base runners then executed a double steal with Schmitz scoring and Casey kept right on coming as the throw got away from the catcher. Billmeier walked and eventually scored as Rollie Kitt got on first by virtue of a Rocket miscue.

Five runs were tallied in the second as the Knights worked the Ar-We-Va defense into throwing the ball around. The Lancers did manufacture hits by Frank Golwitzer, Casey and Billmeier to balloon the lead to 8-0 after the first two cantos.

Staier tallied the ninth run in the third as he reached first on an error, stole both second and third and came home on a ground out.

The Red and Gold threatened in the fourth with Maurice Glass getting as far as third after being walked but Pete Bell, the Rocket thrower, retired the side with no damage.

The Rockets saw the initial sack for the first time in the fifth inning. Craig Dohse walked and took second on a wild pitch. Bell hit a bouncer by second and took second as Dohse scored. Bell later came in for the second Rocket run of the game.

KHS put the game on the shelf in the fifth frame. Ron Pirotte walked and swiped second. He scored on Keat's single. Dick Henkenius walked and with runners on second and third Scott Wille brought the game to an end as he knocked a one baser to bring home the two base runners.

The victory upped the Knights record to 18-1 while the youthful Rockets close out their season unvictorious in ten encounters.

In other tournament action Wednesday night, the Breda St. Bernard's Bobcats were defeated by Odebolt-Arthur, 13 to 8, to wind up the season with an 11 and 6 record. In the other game played at Lake View, Denison defeated Wall Lake 1-0. Odebolt faces Early and Denison takes on Lake View in the quarter finals Friday.

Reds Beat Dodgers 7-6; Gain 1st Place by .002

No. 100 didn't help, and 101 couldn't do it. So 84 became the magic number as Cincinnati again went .002 ahead of Los Angeles.

The Reds regained the National League lead by two percentage points Wednesday night when Leo Cardenas belted a home run with two out in the bottom of the ninth inning that provided a 7-6 victory over the Dodgers.

Cardenas' clinching blow was his third hit of the night and his 84th of the season. Earlier in the slugging match, Vada Pinson's 100th hit had gone to waste, and so had Pete Rose's 101st.

It had appeared a romp for the Reds — against Sandy Koufax — when they shelled the prized left-hander for five runs in the first two innings. They finally chased Koufax, winner of eight straight, in the fifth but the Dodgers caught fire, and eventually caught up when Jim Lefebvre's two-run homer made it 6-6 in the eighth.

But Cardenas gave Cincinnati its second victory in the three-game set with his homer off Bob Miller in the ninth.

In other NL action — Tom Haller homered with two on in the 13th against Bob Gibson, lifting San Francisco to a 4-2 decision that ended St. Louis' winning string at seven games; Chris Short's three-hit pitching and Clay Dalrymple's eighth-inning homer enabled Philadelphia to nip Pittsburgh 1-0; Rico

Carty's hitting led Milwaukee over Houston 5-2, and Larry Jackson ran his lifetime record to 11-0 against New York as the Chicago Cubs beat the last-place Mets 8-3.

In the AL — Minnesota won its seventh straight, 5-2 over Boston; Cleveland swept a pair from the Chicago White Sox by 4-2 scores, the second in 11 innings; the New York Yankees shaded Detroit 4-3; Baltimore blanked Kansas City 1-0, and Washington trimmed the Los Angeles Angels 3-1.

Gibson, who struck out 12 in his 13-inning stint against the Giants, was touched for a two-out single by Willie Mays before Haller connected for his clinching homer. Each side scored a run in the 12th, the Cards with the help of two San Francisco errors.

Masanori Murakami, the Japanese left-hander, won in relief. Short allowed three singles, walked three and struck out seven in outpitching Bob Friend in the Phils-Pirates squeaker. Philadelphia muffed a couple of chances to score before Dalrymple's homer in the eighth.

Carty drove in two Milwaukee runs with a homer and single and set up another run with a double, while Hank Aaron chipped in with a homer for the Braves. Houston's runs came off homers by Walt Bond and Jim Wynn. Ken Johnson was the winning pitcher, Bob Bruce the loser.
