gram.
In his lecture on "The Re-
formation in a New Perspec-
tive," Dr. Swidler quoted Josef
Lortz and other German Cath-
olic historians he said are re-
searching and writing from a
new, unbiased vieppoint with
noth scientific objectivity and
dep religiosity.
