Meanwhile, Pete Rozelle and Al Davis, commissioners of the NFL and AFL, respectively, generally have refused comment on the developments concerning the feud or its possible termination.

The New York Times said the rival leagues are holding "secret peace talks" and that there were hopes for "an agreement, probably in the form of a common draft, within a week."
