Daeges came to the plate and tapped back toward the mound. Brechler bluffed the runner at third back and then threw widely to first to permit Heithoff to score.

Carroll's star lefthander then proceeded to handcuff the Knights the rest of the way as he fanned 11 in five and two-thirds innings. He got out of the second inning game by striking out Middendorf and Walden.

With one down in the third, Joe Badding doubled to right-center and got to third on a subsequent error. Denny Bellinghausen fanned, Heithoff drew a walk, but Baldus popped to first to end that threat.


Tom Jons got Carroll's first hit when he led off the bottom of the third with a single to left, but he was forced by Lehrkamp who later was thrown out trying to steal second. Marc Baudler was safe on an error, but Denny Vetter popped to first to end the inning.

Middendorf singled for the Knights with two down in the fourth but was stranded by Walden's strikeout.

Scott Richardson, who led Carroll at the plate with a single and double, got the first of his two safeties with one down in the fourth when he singled to right and took second on an error.

Roger Fuller was out on a foul fly deep behind first and Richardson made it to third after the catch. Brechler walked, but Ken Kieck fanned to end the rally.

Marichal's Four Hitter Halts Cards

Juan Marichal has finally caught up to the St. Louis Cardinals. If the rest of the San Francisco Giants can't say the same come Sept. 29 they'll be playing for a new manager next spring.

Just before Marichal blanked the Cards 3-0 Thursday night and evened his lifetime record against them at 15-15, Herman Franks confirmed reports that he would retire as manager of the Giants if they don't win the National League pennant.

Owner Horace Stineham shouldn't have long to wait before applications start pouring in since the Giants still are in fourth place, 13 games behind St. Louis, after ending the Cards' winning streak at six games.

Elsewhere, Atlanta walloped Houston 7-1 and the New York Mets downed Pittsburgh 3-0. Los Angeles was rained out at Cincinnati and the Philadelphia Phillies and Chicago Cubs were not scheduled.

In the American League, Detroit topped Oakland 3-1, the Chicago White Sox nipped Baltimore 2-1, Minnesota defeated Boston 7-2 and the New York Yankees turned back Washington 4-1.

Marichal, the NL's top winner, ran his record to 17-4 with a four-hitter and even drove in a run with a second-inning single. He retired 17 batters in order over one stretch until Lou Brock singled to open the ninth.

The Giants scored twice off Steve Carlton in the second on singles by Willie Mays, Jim Hart, Hal Lanier and Marichal. They added a run in the eighth when Mays walked, stole second and scored on a single by Jesus Alou.


