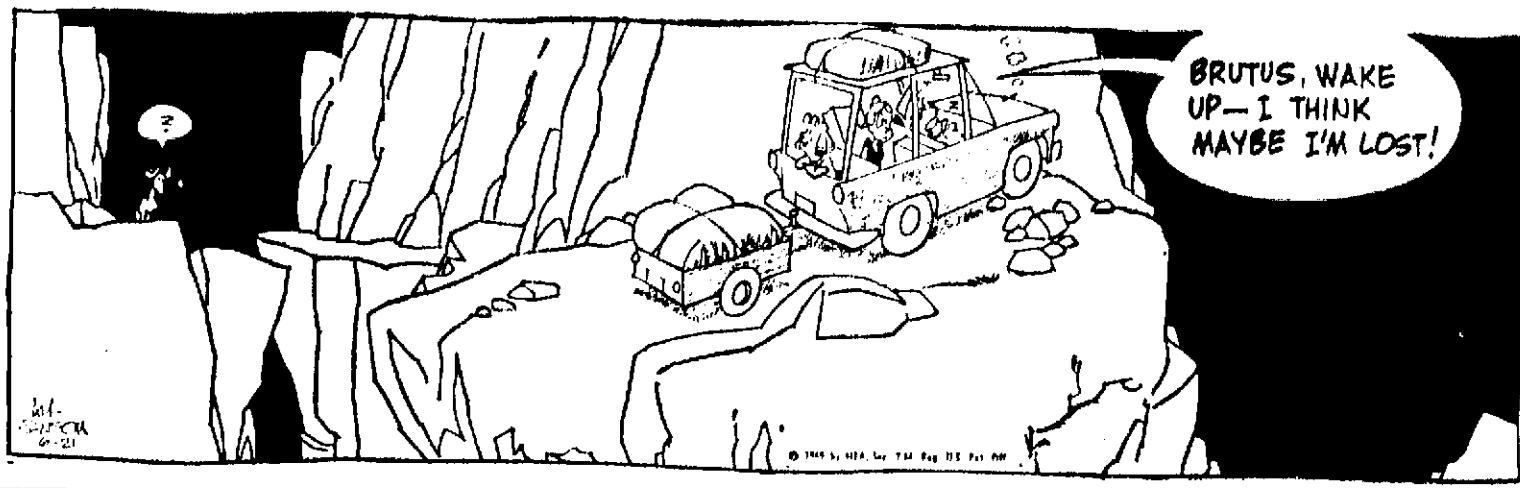

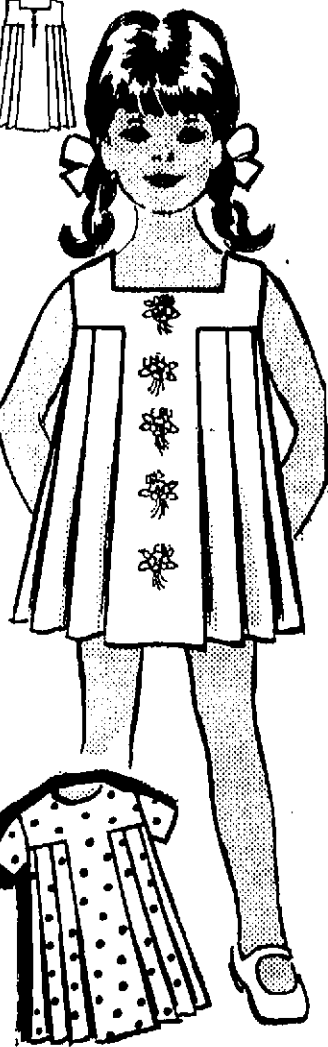

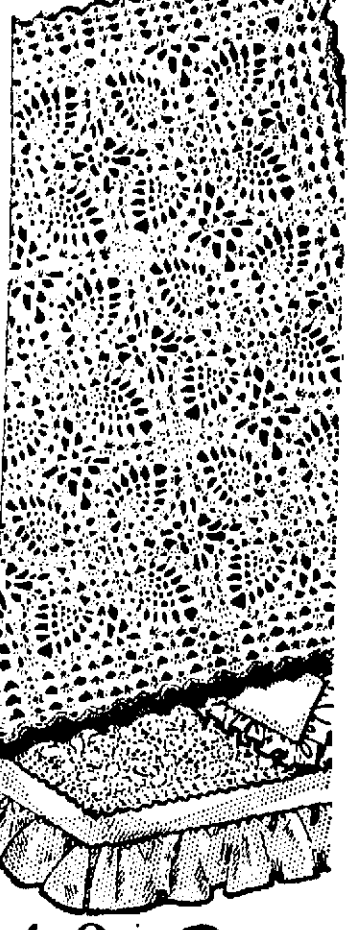

Southpaw Charles Leads By One In \$150,000 Kemper

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Bob Charles, the golfing world's greatest left-hander, was subdued, certainly not cheerful, practically mournful, after establishing the second-round lead in the \$150,000 Kemper Open.

"I'm really not playing that well," the lean New Zealander complained Friday after shooting a two-under-par 70 for a 36-hole total of 138.

"This course is too long for me," he said of the 7,250-yard Quail Hollow Country Club layout. "It's a bit of a struggle.

"The shots are not coming easy to me."

It may sound a little strange for a man leading in the chase for a \$30,000 prize, but there could be a very good reason for Charles' lack of enthusiasm.

Looming over his shoulder, just one shot back at 139, are eight others, including dangerous Dan Sikes, Lee Trevino and ancient Sam Snead.

Five others are at 140 and seven more at 141, putting 21 players within three shots of each other going into the final two rounds of play.

The long-hitting Sikes had the day's best round, 67, while Trevino and the 57-year-old Snead each had 69. They were tied with rookie Bob Payne, 70; Australian Bruce Devlin, 70; England's Tony Jacklin, 69; Mason Rudolph, 70, and Dale Douglas, 70.

Charles, 33, a former British open champion whose last tour victory was in the 1968 Canadian Open, didn't realize he was leading the tournament when he finished and went to the practice tee "to try to get my swing down a little better.

"I'm not swinging well. I'm going from right to left and I want it more square."

"I don't hit the ball far enough for this course. I don't get over the tops of the hills with my drives. A long hitter who does go over the top on his drive will be hitting a four-iron to the green and I'm hitting a four-wood.

"I have been putting well, though. In the last two days I've had three at 40 feet or more."

He got in one 40-footer Friday and also dropped birdie putts of 15 and 18 feet. The other came when he put a five-iron six feet from the pin and canned the putt.

Ryun Endurance Keys Kansas Bid

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Kansas, banking on the endurance of distance ace Jim Ryun, appeared a sure bet to end an eight-year domination by West Coast teams in the NCAA Track and Field Championships today.

By the time the last of 13 final events—some of them nationally televised (ABC)—are over tonight, the Jayhawks hope for 60 points.

That's what they figure it will take to win, double what they had after seven events were completed Friday.

Ryun, the world record-holder in the mile with a clocking of 3:51.1, set his sights on an unprecedented double victory in the mile
