Hastings made it first on a shortstop error and Wand hit into a fielder's choice that erased DeWitt at third. Another shortstop error put Carlson on to load the sacks. An error at second base plated Hastings, but the bases were still stacked. Zeller drew a pass to bring another run across and an error at third put Paaborg on first and plated still another run. McNulty cracked a single to left to keep things going. McVicker drew a pass, but Paaborg leaned too far off base and a peg from home plate went wild, scoring two runs.

Mick Everett came in from center field to take over the mound duties, but the errors kept coming and three more runs crossed the plate. Coach Jerry Hansen signalled Everett back to center and brought catcher Roger Fuller up to the mound for a try at the pitching duties. Fuller managed to retire the side, but by that time, 11 runs had crossed the plate and the Rams held a comfortable 17-7 lead.

The Tigers added another run to their total in the bottom of the sixth, but Jefferson countered with three more runs in the seventh to make the final score, 20-8, Jefferson's favor.

Carroll faces league-leading Kuemper Wednesday, June 11, at Carroll Stadium.
