

KHS Subdues Breda; Denison Mauls Carroll

Bill Henkenius Stymies Bobcats

The Kuemper Knights needed a nine run sixth inning plus a superlative relief job by Bill Henkenius to subdue the Bobcats of Breda (St. Bernard) 10-3 here Thursday night.

The final score is not indicative of the closeness of the game in the early and middle stages.

The Lancers donned the Santa Claus suit to donate three runs to the Bobcats in the early going and the losers responded with a gift of one to give the visitors a 3-1 edge going into the bottom of the sixth.

Glen Koster mastered the Red and Gold during the first five frames. Nick Romey scored for KHS in the third as he ran for Joe Badding. The Kuemper catcher reached second on a two base error and Romey came in on another error of the same dimension.

The one hit by the winners in the first five was a solid singleton by Joe Foley in the fourth.

A three-error first inning by the winners, possibly due to a 10-day layoff, gave Breda their first tally with Jerry Koster crossing. Neil Reising led off by getting on a Kuemper miscue but was nailed at the plate when he elected to come home on a wild pitch.

Lanky Randy Lengeling proved to be his own worst enemy in the third and fourth as a pair of wild pitches cost two runs. Singles by the Koster, Jerry and Glen, set up the run in the third and back to back singles by Bob Polking and Joe Schwabe set the stage for the last Bobcat score.

them on strikeouts. Jerry Koster wiggled a walk out of the KHS southpaw in the fifth but was quickly erased on a snappy double play from Jim Middendorf to Scott Schmitz. The sixth stanza saw Henkenius strikeout the side on nine straight strikes.

Coach Lou Galatich's crew finally got to the lumber wagon in the bottom of the sixth. The Knights still trailed 3-1 and lightning flashed ominously in the northern sky. The distant fireworks fired up the Lancers as they bombarded Koster and his successor, Mike Steinkamp for nine runs on seven hits, two walks, a hit batsman and a couple of Breda bobbles.

Middendorf stroked a single and Dick Heithoff was safe on an error advancing Middendorf to third. The latter came in on a passed ball. Denny Walden popped out behind third but Schmitz walked as did Foley.

Joe Badding greeted Steinkamp with a sharp single to bring home Heithoff and Schmitz. Don Baldus stroked another one bagger to plate Foley. Henkenius flew deep to right and Schmitz tallied.

Dave Daeges continued the parade with a one baser and Middendorf got his second hit of the evening. Heithoff drilled one to center and Denny Walden was hit by a pitch. Schmitz got the final hit of the evening but the nightmare ended for the Bobcats when Walden was nailed at third.

The Knights have a tough chore tonight when they face the second place Denison Monarchs. Kuemper enters the game with a 11-0 record with the visiting Monarchs a half step behind at 11-1.

DENISON — Chip McGinn hurled a two-hitter, and the Denison Monarchs wielded their warclubs for 8 hits, featuring 4 triples to shackle the Carroll Tigers, 10-0, in a six-inning contest here Thursday evening.

It was the fourth time in the last five games that the basement team of the West Central loop has seen the ten-run piling evoked against them. The loss shoves the Bengals deeper into the wall with a 1-12 record, while

Denison maintains its second place status with an 11-1 mark.

Kevin Fineran was the big man at the plate for the Monarchs as the husky first baseman rapped a single, double, and triple. Three more triples were added to the cause by Dick Neumann, Steve McGinn, and Chip McGinn.

Neumann got his club off to a hot start with a long shot to left that went for three bases. Mark Wahrman popped to short for the first out, but Fineran followed with a run-scoring single for the first tally.

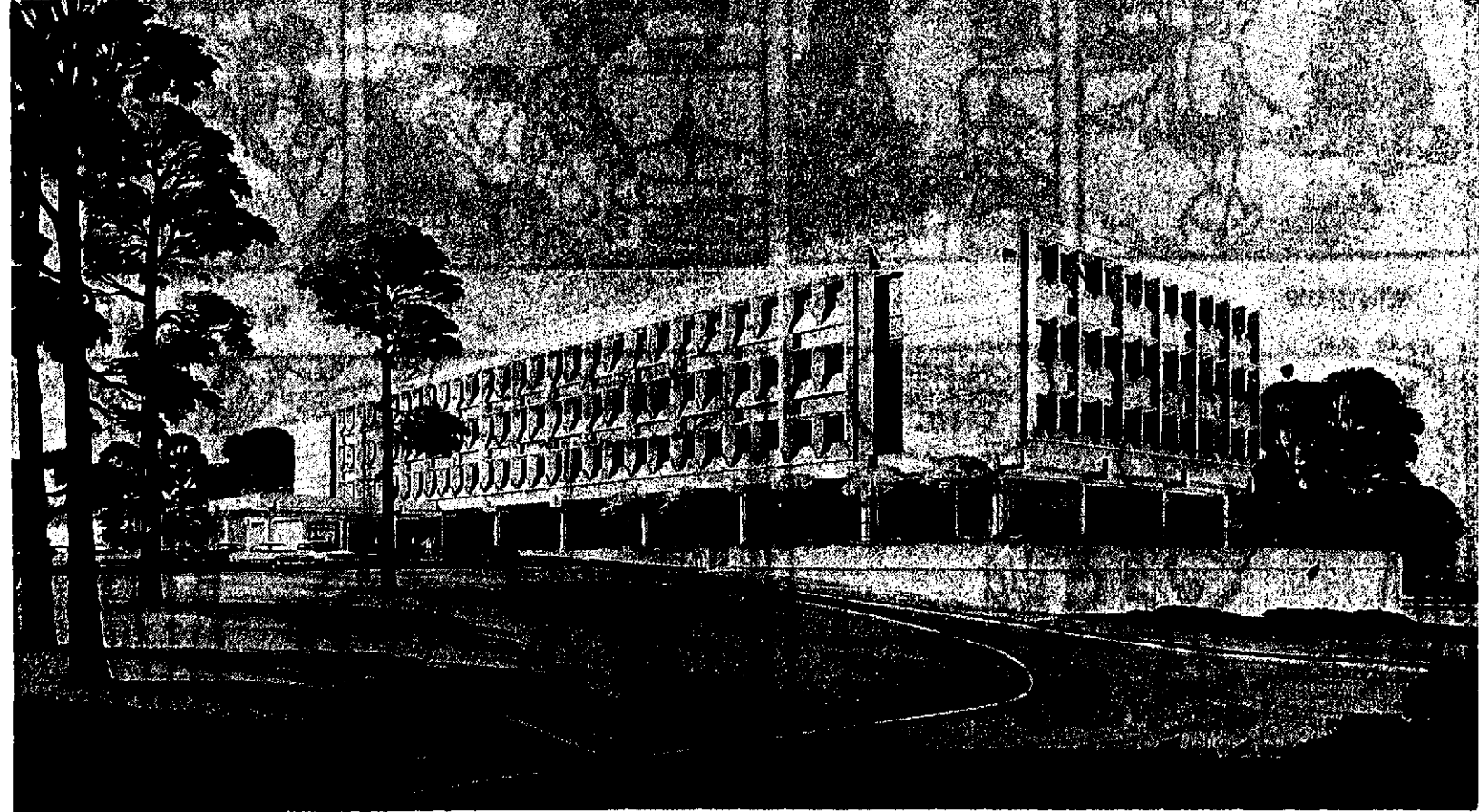
