

Turner Asked for Ruling on County Officials' Pay Law

DES MOINES (AP) — Iowa Attorney Gen. Richard Turner has been asked for a ruling following disclosure that an apparent oversight in a pay law has brought unexpected pay raise windfalls to county officials.

Statehouse sources said Wednesday the county officials benefitting unexpectedly from a loophole in the new law on their salaries are auditors, treasurers, recorders and district court clerks.

The windfalls resulted from dropping a provision in the old Iowa law that omitted intangible properties from valuations on which part of their salaries were computed.

As a result, the sources said, the new law determines the salaries of the county officials in question on county populations and property valuations in the county plus intangible wealths such as stocks, bonds and mortgages previously deleted.

In Des Moines, Polk County Auditor James Maloney said the inclusion of intangible properties in the valuations on which his salary is computed has increased his salary to \$15,200, or \$1,250 more than he anticipated. Maloney's previous salary was \$11,950.

Linn County's auditor, Charles Werner, said at Cedar Rapids his salary apparently will be increased to \$4,000 a year to \$13,350 instead of \$2,000 to \$11,350 as he anticipated.

Only in very few countries, sources said, will pay raises for auditors, treasurers, recorders and district court clerks not exceed what was anticipated. In most countries, raises will be several hundred dollars over expectations.

County officers whose salaries are fixed and are not affected by computations of valuations both real and intangible are sheriffs, county attorneys and supervisors.

Iowa's real property as assessed for valuation in 1967 was \$4.5 billion. Moneys and credits subject to taxation for the year was listed at 2.3 billion.

Maloney said moneys and credits total \$558 million in Polk County and real property \$521 million.

Ultra-Light Tackle For Exciting Fish Challenge

Want to play tug-o-war with a three-pound bass? You can do it with ultra-light tackle, and if you haven't tried it you're missing one of the thrills of a lifetime.

Ultra-light fishing is fast becoming one of the leading methods of angling and rightly so, because it puts the sports fisherman on par with the fish.

We first learned about ultra-light tackle in Homosassa, Fla., where we saw retired Army Gen. Mark Clark come in with a boat load of sea trout and Spanish mackerel, all caught on ultra-light tackle and four-pound test line.

To Gen. Clark, a fisherman with many years experience, this was the ultimate in angling. Each catch proved a torrid battle between fisherman and fish, testing the skills of the angler to land his catch.

A couple of months ago we decided to test some of the new ultra-light tackle on the market.

My fishing partner, Dick Ranney of the Iowa Conservation Commission, and his son Tim, 13, bought a Garcia ultra-light rod and reel, and I got a Berkley ultra-light rig made in Spirit Lake.

We have caught everything from sunfish to crappies, bluegills, largemouth bass, sauger, walleye and dogfish on the rigs, and every moment of it has been an exciting battle.

A three-pound bass I took off an island in the Mississippi was like trying to land a log, and lead to a five-minute battle in boating the fish.

The Berkley rod I use is one of their para-metric rods

which I was attracted to after learning that Fred Brady of Orlando, Fla., used one of the top line Berkleys to win the World Championship Casting Tournament in Switzerland after only three weeks practice.

Ranney prefers his five-foot Garcia because it is more flexible, but the 5-foot-6 Berkley rod appears more balanced to me and the extra stiffness of the rod seems to produce a more accurate cast.

The Berkley rig weighs a total of 11 ounces, and the Garcia is maybe an ounce or two lighter. The only other main differences are in the reel, seats and the reels themselves.

The Garcia offers an interchangeable reel face, a feature Berkley offers on most of its open-face spinning reels except the ultra-light model.

The reel seat on the Garcia consists of two metal bands which can be adjusted to any position for balance as desired.

The Berkley para-metric has a fixed reel seat, but combined with a continuous fiber glass rod extending through the handle it appears to be perfectly balanced for accurate casting.

The Berkley ultra-light reel also features a handle that can be easily switched from left to right, and advantage for the fisherman who is making his first attempt at spin casting.

The ultra-light tackle, with quarter-ounce lures, produce accurate casts consistently at distances up to 50 feet and can turn sunfish into a battling species.

One thing to remember in purchasing ultra-light equipment is that it is a long-term investment in fishing pleasure, so don't skimp on costs. Buy the best equipment suited to your tastes, and you'll discover a feel of the fish you never thought existed.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK: "Golden Eagle" Passports have now gone on sale for \$7 at county offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.
