

Tigers Club Dow City; Knights Paste Eagles

Brechler Hurls 5 Frame 1 Hitter

Steve Brechler, Carroll's ace left-hander, displayed an outstanding performance on the mound here Wednesday evening, blanking non-conference foe, Dow City-Arion, 10-0, on a one-hitter. The game was called after five innings of play in accordance with the ten-run rule.

Despite a controversial put-out play in the second frame, it was Brechler's pitching and hitting that led the Tigers to victory through the five inning stretch. The lanky southpaw whiffed a phenomenal thirteen batters in five innings, and in the batter's box, chalked up four runs batted in, three on a fourth inning triple.

But heated protest came from the Greyhound bench and from several persons in the stadium gathering in the second inning when Brechler fielded a short tap midway to the mound and charged down to the third base line to put the tag on Greyhound base-runner, Jim Biefeldt, who was breaking for the plate. Brechler collided with the Dow City-Arion right-fielder, knocking him off the base path. Biefeldt was not seriously injured. Plate umpire, Robert Smiley, reprimanded Brechler, and play continued.

The Tigers charged into the lead in the bottom of the third inning on a two-run burst. Bob Baudler was sent first with a base on balls to open things for the Carroll club. Baudler advanced on an errant pick-off throw to first and rode in on Ron Anderson's single to right field. Bruce Pettitt followed up with a one-bagger over second base to score the second run.

The Greyhound's center fielder, Dan Sharp, picked up the only hit for his club in the

top of the fourth inning with a hard tap down first base line. Dan Case hit into a fielder's choice that erased Sharp at second base. Wayne Malone and Clayton Keiner fanned to retire the side.

The Bengale exploded for six runs in the bottom half of the fourth inning that set up the margin of victory. Doug Peterson led off with an infield single and registered the first of his two stolen bases. Jim DeBower arched a high shot into center field that scored Peterson and settled him at second base. Wayne Hill kept the fire alive with a one-bagger over shortstop to carve another run on the tally sheet.

Gary Lehrkamp joined Hill on the sacks with a free pass and Anderson chalked up the second of his three singles of the evening to load the sacks. Brechler crashed a long drive into deep left-center field for a triple that notched the sixth through eighth runs for the Tigers.

Yanks Tag McLain But Lose In 11

Denny McLain returned to the baseball wars Wednesday night and showed that he hadn't changed much. He still didn't know what he was doing.

The 26-year-old ace right-hander of the Detroit Tigers was tagged for five runs and eight hits, including three homers, in 5 1-3 innings but wasn't involved in the decision as Mickey Stanley singled home an unearned run in the 11th inning for a 6-5 victory over the New York Yankees.

"I was scared as . . . to be truthful," McLain admitted after getting several thunderous ovations from a packed house of 53,863, largest Tiger Stadium crowd in nine years, larger than any of the Detroit crowds during the 1968 World Series.

"I feel pretty good, but I'm not satisfied because I didn't go nine innings. I'm not thinking like a pitcher yet. I made a couple of mistakes."

Jerry Kenney, Thurman Munson and Bobby Murcer hit the mistakes out of the park.

Elsewhere in the American League, Baltimore blanked Cleveland 3-0, Minnesota edged Kansas City 2-1 in 10 innings, California shaded Milwaukee 4-3, Oakland zipped the Chicago White Sox 3-0 and Boston beat Washington 6-4.

In the National League, the Chicago Cubs defeated St. Louis 5-0, Pittsburgh nipped the New York Mets 4-3, Cincinnati trounced Atlanta 9-2, Los Angeles downed Houston 6-3, San Francisco outgassed San Diego 12-7 and Montreal swept a doubleheader from Philadelphia 11-1 and 4-1.

Kenney said the Yankees were "waiting for McLain's curve ball and were taking it, since he was a bit off target. He'd get one curve over, miss with another and come in with the fast ball. But," Kenney added, "he will be pretty sharp before the season is over."
