

# Kuemper Edges Tigers, 6-5

Kuemper's Randy Otto walked away from Carroll Stadium Friday evening looking a little taller than usual. And with good reason. Otto, who spends the better half of the ball game in a crouched position behind home plate fielding pitches, cracked a triple to the right-center field fence in the eighth inning and rode in on a passed ball, handing the Knights a 6-5 cliff-hanger triumph over the Carroll Tigers.

All the action of the eastern division showdown centered around the beginning and end. Neither club could shake the idle scoreboard in the second through sixth innings until the Tigers forced a 5-5 deadlock in the bottom of the seventh inning.

The Knights shocked the Tiger hopefuls in the opening frame with a four-run explosion. Jim Nurse led off the action with a single to right field, and advanced on a passed ball. Bill Henkenius drew a pass, and Dan Schmitz stroked a single over

third base to score Nurse. Steve Auen was hit by a pitch to load the sacks, and Otto drew a base on balls to force in another run. A wild pitch was Schmitz' green light for the third tally, and a subsequent passed ball sent Auen across paydirt for the fourth run.

From that point on, it seemed as though both teams were at a stalemate. Schmitz rapped a single to right field in the third frame and advanced to third base on Auen's pop-up to center field and a passed ball. But Rick Golwitzer went down on strikes, stranding Schmitz at third. Bruce Pettitt smacked the first of two triples for Carroll in the fourth frame, but suffered the same fate as Schmitz.

Jim Nurse got Kuemper into action again in the top of the seventh with a triple to deep left field. Henkenius smashed a grounder past the Carroll shortstop to plate Nurse for the fifth Kuemper tally.

The Tigers finally broke into the scoring column in the bottom half of that inning.

Bob Brown got things underway with a single to right field. Bob Baudler lived on an error at first base, and Dan Bernholtz followed with a tap to third base that was fumbled. Ron Anderson lined a hard shot through the keyhole for a single, but the ball got away from Kuemper's center fielder and three Carroll runners escaped over the plate.

Pettitt posted his second three-bagger of the evening with a long shot to left-center field, scoring the fourth run. A controversial balk call on Kuemper relief hurler, Henkenius, sent Carroll fans into a frenzy as Pettitt stroled across the plate for the tying run.

The Knights put the cap on the ball game in the eighth-inning thriller as Otto pushed the Kuemper club back into the lead, 6-5. Henkenius put the Tigers down in order in the bottom half of that inning to end the game.

In the only other Midwest League action Friday evening, the Perry Bluejays ripped Lake

City, 8-3. Carroll teams will be in action Monday. Kuemper will play host to Perry, and the Tigers trek to Jefferson.
