

Lead Continues to Melt—

Giants Wave on Flag Day

Monday being Flag Day, the San Francisco Giants continued to waver.

The beleaguered Giants, still unable to shake the June bugs, lost for the 10th time in 13 games this month, bowing to Philadelphia 9-4. Combined with Los Angeles' 3-2 victory over the New York Mets, it pared the Giants' lead in the National League West to five games. It stood at 10½ on

Elsewhere, Houston nipped Pittsburgh 5-4, Cincinnati whipped St. Louis 7-2, the Chicago Cubs edged Atlanta 3-2 and San Diego shaded Montreal 2-1.

The day started out badly for the Giants with the announcement that slugger Willie McCovey will have his ailing knees re-examined when the team returns home Thursday and may need an operation. It didn't take long for things to get worse.

Utilityman Frank Johnson

was struck in the face by a ball during infield practice and was unconscious for at least 10 minutes. X-rays were negative but Johnson was said to be suffering from "ataxia to the right," which means he veers to the right when he walks.

The Phillies then gave Gaylord Perry a severe case of ataxia to the showers. Willie Inning homer and the Phils exploded for six runs in the second, their biggest outburst of the season.

Roger Freed singled in the tie-breaking run, pitcher Rick Wise hammered a three-run homer and Tim McCarver delivered a two-run shot. Oscar Gamble connected in the fifth.

The Dodgers used a solo homer by Willie Davis in the first inning and Bobby Valentine's two-run double in the third to beat the Mets and ace Tom Seaver. Jim Brewer relieved starter Don Sutton after the Mets scored both their runs in the seventh.

Carroll Tigers Lose Third Straight to Jefferson, 7-1

Carroll was never a threat to the Rams. Jefferson jumped into the lead when Mike Wolterman scored on a passed ball in the first inning, after three

of the first four Tiger batters had been called out on strikes.

Jefferson piled all their scoring into the first three innings, while the Tigers were scoreless until the fifth.

The third inning was the final nail in the coffin for the Tigers. Wolterman led off for the Rams and gained a base on balls. Tom Lynch, the Ram pitcher, followed with a single.

John Shawba stepped to the plate and put himself on first

with a single. With the bases loaded Tim Lawson connected on the first pitch and gave the ball a free ride out of the ball park. This boosted the Ram lead to seven runs with only one man out in the third inning.

The Lawson slam didn't seem to bother Tiger pitcher, Randy Plotz, for the next two men up were sent to the dugout swinging.

The only Tiger run was scored by Mike Tryon in the fifth inning. Tryon socked a double

to lead off the inning. Ron Anderson walked and moved Tryon to third. Tryon then scored from third on an error by Shawba.

The Carroll Tigers will be idle the rest of this week, but will trek to Perry Monday, June 21.

Shaving Strokes

I would never tee it up in a pro tournament without hitting balls and putting for at least 45 minutes. But I know that the average player, who has trouble fitting in a round of golf, often arrives at the course with only a couple of minutes before his tee time.

What should you do to prepare yourself in that short span? First, I would have tried to prepare myself mentally on the way to the course.

Once there, I'd do some quick toe-touching exercises to stretch my back muscles. Then I'd make a few big turns with a

club behind my back and under my elbows.

Finally, I'd take my driver and take as many full swings



as I could. The looser you get, the harder you can swing. This is the club you're going to have to hit to start your round.

I know that a lot of fellows will swing two and even three clubs at once, waiting to hit away, but I think it's a very bad idea. Your driver will feel too light when you address the ball, and you won't have the control you should.
