

# Knights Topple Carroll, 3-1

A scrappy crew of Carroll Tigers nearly planned the powerful Kuemper Knights to the ropes here Saturday evening, but the south side sluggers rebounded in the seventh inning to break a 1-1 stalemate and toppled the Bengals, 3-1, in the semi-final round of sectional tournament action.

The Knights, 14-8 on the season, earned the right to meet Atlantic in the final round of sectional play. That game will be played at Carroll Stadium Monday at 8 p.m. Atlantic holds a season's mark of 10-12. Coach Ted Edward's Tiger crew retires for the season with a 9-12 record.

The action was fast and steady here Saturday evening, but relatively unproductive through the first five frames. Kuemper hurler, Bill Henkenius, and Carroll's slick right-

hander, Randy Plotz, delivered quickly from the mound under the threat of cloudy skies. Both pitchers limited the opposition to a single hit through the first four innings, and neither club pushed a run over the plate. The Knights went on to tag Plotz for six hits, while Henkenius emerged the victor in all departments with a two-hitter on 11 strike outs.

Kuemper broke into the scoring column in the top of the fifth inning with a solo run. Steve Auen was waived to first base with a walk in the lead-off slot, and quickly stole second off of Carroll's husky catcher, Bob Brown. Mark Heithoff drove a hard-line single up the keyhole to plate Auen for the first tally of the ball game.

The Tigers retaliated in the bottom of the sixth inning to deadlock the contest at one

apiece. Brown led off with a sharp grounder to second base, but the ball was hobbled and thrown too late to stop the Carroll catcher. Pete Marz stepped in to relieve Brown from the base paths, and was promptly cut short at second base on Ron Anderson's fielder's choice. Bruce Pettitt sent Anderson to third base with a two-bagger to right-center field. Henkenius hurled a pitch out of the reach of his battery mate and Anderson skipped across the plate unmolested.

Kuemper's guns were silent in the sixth frame, but the thunder broke loose in the top half of the seventh inning. Terry Kasperbauer led off for the Knights and greeted the

challenge with a double over third base. Dan Nurse popped out to the mound for the first out, but Jim Baldus kept the action alive with a booming triple to deep left-center field. Jerry Nurse fanned for the second out, but Jim Nurse sealed the verdict with a three-bagger to right field to score the third run.

The bottom of the Tigers' batting order faced the Kuemper defense in the last of the seventh and Henkenius put the Carroll batters down in order with a pair of strike outs and a ground out to second base.

GLIDDEN — Manning displayed its powerhouse strength here Sunday afternoon winning the Iowa West Swim Conference title on 219 1/2 points. Sac City challenged Manning with 203 points and second place.

Manning jumped into the lead with 54 points after the first event and never fell behind. However, the real race centered around Carroll, Guthrie Center and Sac City as they jockeyed for second, third and fourth place points.

Julie Higgins, Sac City, and Brad Zerwas, Manning, topped the individual swimmers with three first places each. Miss Higgins won the girls 11-12 freestyle, individual medley and butterfly, while Zerwas captured the boys 11-12 freestyle, backstroke and individual medley. Cam Topel, Carroll, remained undefeated this year in conference backstroke competition, winning the girls 13-14 event.

## One-Hitter Paces Bucs by Dodgers

Luke Walker walked into the Pirates' locker room after having come within three outs of hurling the first no-hitter in Pittsburgh in 64 years.

Steve Blass, another member of the Pirates' underrated pitching staff and the club's top comedian, shouted across the crowded room, "Walker, I know the solution for you—start you every three weeks."

It was meant to be funny, but it wasn't to Walker. The 27-year-old left-hander, the Pirates' big winner last season with 15 victories, hadn't started a game since June 29, until he faced the Los Angeles Dodgers Sunday.

Walker enhanced his chances of regaining a regular starting berth—and nearly pitched himself into the record books—handcuffing the Dodgers on one hit—Joe Ferguson's lead-off homer in the ninth—as the Pirates completed a doubleheader sweep with a 7-1 victory, extending their winning streak to 11 games—longest in the majors this season.

The Pirates, who increased their National League East lead to 1 1/2 games over second-place Chicago, won the opener 3-2.

Elsewhere in the National League, Chicago trimmed Montreal 8-4; St. Louis dropped the staggering New York Mets 8-5; San Francisco split with Atlanta, winning the opener 5-4 in 12 innings and losing the night-5 1/2-inning rain-stormed opener also divided, the Phillies taking the first game 1-0 and
