

# Restitution **Idea Retained**


DES MOINES, Iowa (AP)-A legislative conference committee that worked out a compromise bill allowing Iowa judges to grant leniency to defendants has retained the idea that a criminal should pay for his victim's losses.

The bill was agreed upon Friday by the 10 House and Senate members of the committee, The measure would require defendants who are "reasonably able to do so" to agree to make restitution to their victims before getting deferred or suspended sentences.

The House and Senate could not agree on the details of the bill and it was sent to the conference committee.

However, the two chambers had endorsed the concept of deferred sentencing, which would permit judges to allow some defendants to escape having a permanent record of involvement in criminal activity.
