Tharnish Plays Steady Golf to Take First Women's CC Title

"It was about as cool as a game I've ever played," said Betty Tharnish after nailing down her first Women's Carroll Country Club Golf Championship Wednesday afternoon on a muggy, muggy day.

Tharnish played steady golf to take the title from defending champion, Jill Juergens, who on Tuesday set a course record for nine holes with an even par 35.

Tharnish overcame a five-

stroke Juergens lead Wednesday to win by three shots over the recent Carroll High School graduate. Tharnish finished with an 82-81-163 as compared to Juergens' 77-89-166. Third-place went to Joan Blohm at 179 on two-day rounds of 91-88-179.

Tharnish led Juergens by one shot heading to the 18th green, the final hole of the 36-hole grind. Tharnish got down in one putt on the 18th for a par, while Juergens had her putting

troubles, taking a six to finish three back.

Tharnish, who captured the Carroll Municipal Women's crown last year, felt the turning point was at the seventh hole when Juergens hit one out-of-bounds. "I picked up three shots on the hole and Jill never caught up."

"I was never in trouble," added the new champion. "My brother told me to keep my head down and watch the ball and that's what I did." Of her four nine-hole rounds, Tharnish put together a 39 on Tuesday and a 39 on her first time around Wednesday. "It's the first time I've ever broken 40 for nine holes on this course," she commented.

Phyllis Kunze took the first flight by six shots over Ginny Perschau, firing a 93. Second flight honors went to Joan Fangman with a 101. Sue Thraen won the third flight title by one shot over Norma Greteman and Pat Beck.

Lois Bierl won the fourth flight by one shot over Zita Comes, 111 to 112 and the fifth flight was won by Marion Goodwin who fired a 117 to beat Liz Rice by one stroke and Marge Stangl by two.

Marilyn Hammen took the sandbagger's flight with a 120.

Carroll's Pete Marz tossed a no-hit shutout against Glidden-Ralston Wednesday night in the second round of sectional tournament play here at Carroll Stadium. The Tigers won the contest handily, 14-0, in five innings.

In an earlier game, Scranton routed Coon Rapids, 17-6, in five innings after building up a 15-0 advantage after 2½ innings.

Carroll and Scranton will meet in one semifinal game Friday night at 8 p.m. at Carroll Stadium, while the other semifinal game will pit Manning against St. Bernard's at B'eda. The final is set for Monday at Carroll Stadium.

Marz had little trouble in setting down the Wildcats who entered the game with a 6-7 record. Five Wildcats reached base, four by walks and one by a hit by pitch. The big Tiger right hander fanned nine and only one Glidden-Ralston batter hit the ball out of the infield. That was Dave Copp who flied out to medium left field in the first inning.

Carroll, now 9-7 on the season and winner of five straight games, banged out 11 hits off of losing pitcher Bryce Hofstad. Three of the hits were triples by Marz, Lonnie Lehrkamp and

Dan Sheehan. Lehrkamp's three-bagger was the big blow, clearing the bases in the second inning.

The Tigers jumped off to a 2-0 lead after the opening frame as Marz tripped to deep center scoring Tom Nam who had reached base on a drop third strike by the catcher. Steve Sundermann then singled home Marz.

Carroll scored eight times in the second inning sending 11 men to the plate. The big hit in the inning was Lehrkamp's triple that made it 9-0. Ted Nam drove in another run with a single and the other four runs scored on three Glidden-Ralston errors.

The Tigers made it 11-0 after three as Tom Nam scored on a ground out. Two runs scored in the fourth on a two-run triple by Sheehan and the 14th run scored in the fifth as Jeff Petersen came home on an error.

Scranton-Coon Rapids

Scranton squared its season mark at 8-8 in the opening game as they pounded two Coon Rapids pitchers for 10 hits. Coon Rapids, which closed with a 1-11 mark, helped the Trojans out by committing six errors.

The Trojans made a rout of it early, scoring four times in the first; adding six in the second; and getting five more in

**ISU Stadium**

The stadium design committee of the Iowa State University Foundation has officially formulated plans Wednesday for a new football arena to be completed by the fall of 1975.

The facility is to be located south and slightly west of the Hilton Coliseum. It will have 40,000 seats, artificial turf and is expected to cost about \$6 million.

Barring unforeseen difficulties, bids will be let in September, ground will be broken in October, and the stadium will be ready for use 22 months later.

The addition of end zone seating, perhaps on a temporary basis, would boost the capacity to about 48,000.

Iowa State's present Clyde Williams Field seats 35,000, but

**Quarterback Ineligible**

Jonas Sears, who started seven games at quarterback as a freshman last season, will miss the 1973 Drake University football season because of scholastic ineligibility.

Drake coach Jack Wallace made the announcement Wednesday. The loss leaves the Bulldogs without an experienced signal caller.

"Jonas is a young man with a wife and two children and his summer employment is very important to him," said Wallace. "He could have returned to summer school and gained his eligibility, but we both felt it was important that he earn as much money as possible this summer."

Wallace said that when Sears didn't enroll for the second semester of summer school this week "the issue was settled."

The top quarterback candidate is Mike Zelenovich, a junior transfer from the University of Missouri. Also in the running is sophomore Barney Rosenberg and three freshman candidates.

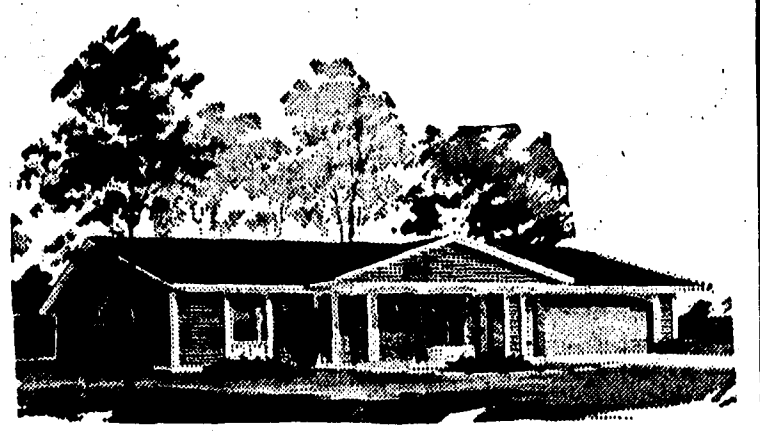
**Hawkeye Recruits**
