

Kuemper Gets Revenge, 4-1

DENISON — Kuemper got "sweet" revenge here Tuesday night as Dean Heisterkamp tossed a three-hitter and Mark Heithoff delivered an insurance double in the seventh inning for two runs as the Knights whipped Jefferson, 4-1.

Jefferson beat the Knights twice during the season behind the arm of hard-throwing Chris Blackburn, 4-3, and 3-2, but Lou Galetich's club got to Blackburn for seven hits here in the first round of the Class AA district tournament, four of them going for doubles.

Kuemper broke a 1-1 tie in

the top of the fifth as George Neil doubled after two out. Terry Kasperbauer then hit a high fly ball to Ram second baseman Leo Brooker who had it temporarily, but then dropped it for an error, giving the Knights a 2-1 lead.

Kuemper expanded the lead in the seventh as Neil and Kasperbauer lined singles after two out. Mark Heithoff then stroked a double to right center for two runs and a final 4-1 score.

The Knights, who now play Perry tonight in the semifinal here at 8 p.m., scored first in the second as Jeff Hunter doubled and came home on a single by Steve Garbier.

The Rams, who finished the season at 12-9, got their lone run in the fourth as Blackburn walked, moved to third on a fielder's choice and scored on Jim Cadden's double.

The Knights had a no out threat going in the fourth, but failed to score. Mark Heithoff led off with a double as Jefferson left fielder Ed Whitver misjudged a fly ball. Hunter then walked and went to second on a stolen base to put runners at second and third. But Blackburn got Garbier on a pop out, John Heithoff on a ground out and Mark Hermesen on a fly to right to avoid any serious damage.

Knight Notes:

If Kuemper wins tonight, they will play in the district final here Thursday night against either Atlantic, or Missouri Valley for the right to move on to sub-state play next week.

The victory by Heisterkamp gave him a 6-2 pitching log for the season. The one earned run that he gave up lowered his earned run average to 2.19 in 56 and two-thirds innings pitched this summer.

Mark Heithoff's two hits in four times at bat upped his batting average to .390 on the year. His two doubles gave him 10 for the year, the most on the team.

The Knights are now 15-9 and winner of two straight games.

JEFFERSON — Eric Siemer and Todd Pettitt pitched the Carroll Senior Little League All-Stars in to the championship game of the district tournament here Tuesday.

Siemer tossed a five-hitter in a 12-4 opening romp by Tri-County (composed of teams from Buena Vista, Sac and Pocahontas counties. It was then Pettitt's turn as he threw a three-hitter at Le Mars in the second game, handing that team their first loss in the double-elimination tournament.

Carroll and Le Mars will meet today at 6 p.m. at Le Mars with the winner advancing to the state tournament Thursday at Jefferson.

Carroll-Tri-County

Catcher Joe Roetker's lead-off homer in the fourth, his first blast of the game, got Carroll going. Roetker's blast cut Tri-County's lead to 4-3.

Carroll then scored four more times in the inning as Larry McLellan reached base on an error, but was thrown out at second. Paul Ludwig and Steve Scharfenkamp then reached base via errors. Then Marty Meshek doubled to left center to bring home two runs and put Carroll ahead 5-4.

Tigers Out of Tourney as Scranton Wins

The Scranton Trojans scored two runs on a Carroll error in the seventh inning to post a come-from-behind semi-final sectional tournament win here Tuesday night, 9-8. Scranton, now with a 9-8 record will meet the winner of the Manning-Breda St. Bernard game in the sectional final here Thursday evening.

The semi-final sectional game between Manning and Breda St. Bernard will be played at Breda tonight. It was postponed from Tuesday night because of a wet field.

Carroll's loss to the Trojans brought their record to 9-8 and eliminated them from further tournament play. Although the 9-8 record is not extremely impressive, Tiger mentor Ted Edwards pointed out it represents the first winning season ever for a Tiger baseball team.

Scranton rallied from an 8-1 deficit with a six-run fifth inning to move just one run behind the Tigers going into the seventh. The Trojans' first two men up in the seventh were out on a strikeout and a fly. But Dean O'Tool's walk, Henry Buswell's third consecutive hit by a pitched ball and a walk to Gary Hoyt loaded the bases.

But Tiger first baseman Jeff Petersen dropped a throw from pitcher Lonnie Lehrkamp on Al Robson's ground ball and both O'Tool and Buswell scored to give Scranton the lead, 9-8. Scranton held the Tigers scoreless in the last of the seventh to collect the tournament win.

Carroll picked up its runs in the second and fourth innings using five hits. The Trojans scored all their runs in the fourth, fifth and seventh innings using six hits.

Steve Hupp went the distance for the Trojans on the mound to collect the win. He chalked up 15 strikeouts and gave up eight walks. Lehrkamp pitched just three innings for the Tigers, but allowed six runs and was tagged with the loss. Pete Marz
