But the Tigers exploded as Todd Pettitt led off with an infield single and went to second on a wild throw to first.


Catcher Larry Bock walked then leadoff hitter Todd Buck sacrificed Pettitt and Bock to second and third.

A walk to Lonnie Lehrkamp loaded the bases then Ted Nam walked to force in the first Carroll run.


Pete Marz then stroked a single to right center that got through the right fielder's leg. allowing three runs to score, making it 4-2 Tigers.
