

# Marz Loses on One-Hitter

SAC CITY — Pete Marz hurled a one-hitter for Carroll High here Monday night but it was that one hit that did the Tigers in.

Scott Pollock's single in the bottom of the seventh scored Jim Lee and gave Sac City a 3-2 win, raising the Indians' record to 5-7.

The loss dropped Carroll to 7-9 and they finish the regular season Wednesday at Lake View against Lake View-Auburn.

The host Indians turned three Tiger errors and a passed ball into a run in the bottom of the first and added another tally in the fourth on

hit batsman, wild pitch and passed ball.

Lee scored in the first inning after reaching second on a Carroll error and advanced to third on another miscue. Lee crossed the plate on a passed ball.

Scott Stebbe was hit by a pitch in the fourth, advanced to second on a wild pitch, stole third and scored on another passed ball.

The score stood at 2-0 as Carroll began batting in the fifth.

Larry Bock led off with a single and then Jeff Petersen doubled to advance pinch runner Rick Beyer to third.

Tom Reiter grounded out, scoring Beyer and Lonnie Lehrkamp socked a ground-rule double to score Petersen.

Pollock broke the 2-2 deadlock to win the game. After striking out the first two Indian batters, Marz gave up a base on balls to Lee. The Sac City shortstop moved up on a stolen base and a passed ball. Then came Lee's game-winning base hit.

Between the two pitchers, the sides went down in order seven times, five of those times belonging to Galbraith.

For the first four innings a hit batsman and two errors

made the only three Tiger baserunners.
