Kohorst Tosses No-Hitter

LAKE CITY — Heroes were plentiful for Kuemper here Friday night, but none was more important than Knight pitcher Al Kohorst's curve ball.

Kohorst's breaking ball left almost every batter in the Lake City lineup swinging where the ball wasn't, as the Knights tallied their second lopsided win in as many nights, 10-0.

Thursday night Kuemper downed Perry 12-1.

The win gave Kuemper a winning record, 4-3, after a shaky start to the season. Lake City dropped to 1-3.

Seven Eagles reached base, four on walks and three on errors, as Kohorst hurled a no-hitter. Kohorst and his teammates managed 12 hits,

including four extra-base hits.

A player who was in his second game of the season led the Knight hitting attack. Craig Bellinghausen hit three safeties, including a double, and scored two runs.

Joe Roetker and Russ Ruppier each knocked in three runs. One of Roetker's runs-batted-in came in the third when the catcher belted a home run.

Ruppier put the first Knight tally on the board after he beat out an infield hit, advanced on an error and a sacrifice and scored on another error. He crossed the plate when Larry McLellan was caught in a run-down between first and second and the second baseman elected to try to nail Ruppier at the plate.

Eagle catcher Larry McCaulley missed the tag — a run had scored and McLellan was safe at second.

The Knights put together their big inning in the seventh as three hits, two walks and a pair of Eagle errors added up to four runs.

Kohorst raised his record to 2-1 for the year with the win. Knight Coach Lou Galetich said, "We're beginning to put things together... beginning to concentrate on the fielding."

Galetich and the Knights will host St. Edmond of Fort Dodge Tuesday. Junior Varsity action is slated to begin at 6 p.m., with the

varsity game to start at 8.

Kuemper will play in the Lewis Central double-elimination tournament in Council Bluffs Thursday through Sunday.
