

# Tigers Take Consolation

Carroll captured the consolation championship in the Kuemper Invitational by crushing conference rival Denison, 13-1.

The game was called by mutual agreement between Carroll Head Coach Ted Edwards and the Monarchs' boss Joel Franken in the bottom of the third inning with the Tigers still batting.

The victory was sweet revenge for the Tigers, who dropped a heartbreaking 3-2 conference game Friday night at Denison after leading 2-0.

The Tigers pounded out 11

hits against two Denison hurlers.

Jim Molitor led the way by going three-for-three.

The big blow, however, for Carroll was Eric Siemer's two-run homer over the 353-foot sign in right center-field.

Siemer finished with three runs batted in as did Todd Buck and Jim Petersen.

Petersen had a big blow in the second when he cleared the bases with a three-run double to center.

Tom Reiman pitched the three innings for Carroll,

giving up two hits and fanning six to gain his fourth win of the season without a loss.

Carroll, now 12-5, travels to Lake City tonight for a 7:30 p.m. league test.

# CHS Drops Loop Test

DENISON — Denison ended Carroll's Midwest Conference baseball winning streak, 3-2, here Friday night.

It marked the Tigers' first conference loss in 22 games, but it left Head Coach Ted Edwards' club still in first place at 7-1. Denison is now 6-1.

It was a tough one to lose for Carroll's Todd Pettitt who allowed just three hits and struck out five.

The Tigers managed six hits off Denison's ace lefty, Terry Denker, but could get only two runs.

Twice the Tigers had good chances to score off of Denker, but couldn't, stranding runners at second and third.

Carroll took a 1-0 lead in the second as Jim Molitor reached on an infield hit, stole second and scored on Dan Wittrock's single.

The Tigers made it 2-0 in the fourth as Brad Edwards and Eric Siemer singled. After

Siemer was forced out at second, Edwards came home on a pass ball.

A single, an error and a sacrifice fly by Denker cut Carroll's lead to 2-1 in the fourth.

The Monarchs scored their winning runs in the fifth as a single by Jim Draper got things going. Denison then used two Carroll errors, a sacrifice and another single to win it.

## Western to Watson

OAK BROOK, Ill. (AP) — With a stroke of luck, Tom Watson overcame his own blundering and putting problems to win his fourth tournament of the 1977 pro golf tour.

He admitted he played poorly on the hole that clinched his one-stroke victory Sunday in the Western Open.

Heading into the 17th hole, the Masters king held a one-shot lead over Johnny Miller and Wally Armstrong. Ahead of him was a tough, par-four hole with a pair of sand traps and trees on the left side of the fairway.

He aimed for the bunkers, intending the ball to fade to the right and the middle of the fairway. It didn't. Playing his second shot from a hard dirt lie in the rough, he made a fine recovery as the ball landed on the rear fringe of the green, leaving a 16-foot putt.

"It was entirely too hard. But it hit the back of the cup and went in," said Watson. "If it missed the hole, it's five or six feet past the hole."

Watson's birdie gave him a two-stroke margin and provided the cushion that enabled him to three-putt from 20 feet for a bogey on the 18th hole and still take his second Western Open crown in four years.
