

Carroll tourney baseball results

KUEMPER INTO FINALS
 Kumper moved into the championship game of the Carroll Invitational baseball tournament with a 3-2 eight inning victory over Scranton Sunday afternoon.
 Jeff Kruse, the tourneys most valuable player, singled home pinch runner Ken Knight from second to win it.
 Knight was running for John Loew who led off with his third single of the game. Then Gary Snyder had an infield hit to set-up Kruse's game-winning off of Trojan pitcher Jay Juergens.
 Paul Baldus threw a six-hitter and fanned 14 to pick up his second win of the year against no losses, while Juergens fell to 2-3.
 Scranton, now 4-6, took a 1-0 lead in the first on a single by Jeff Montheil.
 Kumper tied it in the first on a run-scoring single by Loew and made it 2-1 in the third on another single by Loew.
 Jerry Slocum's run-scoring single in the fifth tied the game for Scranton. Slocum had three hits and Montheil two.
 Dave Diers added two hits for Kumper.

ST. EDMOND ADVANCES

 The victory puts Carroll's loop mark at 3-2 and just a

game back of front-running Jefferson which is 4-1.
 The Tigers, who lost to Scranton Saturday night in their own tournament, play Audubon at home tonight, starting at 8 p.m.
 "Edwards pitched a super game," commented Tiger boss Tim Ryan. "I was also real proud of our team spirit and attitude. Everyone was fired-up."
 "It was an important win," continued Ryan. "It puts us

right back in the running for the Midwest crown."
 The Tigers had to come back all night as they sent the game into extra innings with a run in the seventh on an error and two walks.
 Sac City, now 1-4 in loop play, took the lead in their sixth on singles by Dave Lee and Doug Samuelson.
 After the Indians grabbed a 5-2 lead in the fifth, Carroll tied it with three runs in the sixth on a single by Jim Molitor, an error, a walk and a two-run double by Roger Bock.
