AP Special Correspondent DENVER (AP) — There is no need to legislate against violence in sports, insists former Heisman Trophy winner and all-pro footballer Doak Walker.

"Leave it to the players," adds Walker. "They will police themselves. From my experience, I found that the guys who persisted on trying to get in some dirty licks never lasted very long.

Walker was a triple threat backfield star at Southern Methodist University in 1945, 1947-49, taking a year out to serve in Uncle Sam's Army, and he won college football's highest award, the Heisman

Trophy, in his senior year. From SMU, he went into the pro game with the Detroit Lions, playing six years, making all-pro and sharing in three divisional and two National Football League championships.

'At Detroit, we had what we called the 'dead dog play,' "
