M. E. McCullough, head of the animal science depart-ment at the Georgia Agricultural Experiment Station, Griffin, Ga., believes Agricultural Experiment Station, Griffin, Ga., believes we need to use more silage in beef production. "I question using silage in brood cow operations, but silage is excellent for carrying calves to heavier weights." He says that 100 pounds of beef gain per ton of silage is a good rule of thumb. "At our experiment station, we have averaged about 16 tons of corn silage followed by 8 tons of wheat silage. From these 24 tons, we should be able to produce at least a ton of beef gain per acre." Beef producers considering use of silage must be in the business to stay. McCullough observed, because of the sizeable investment. The producer who puts up only 150 tons would have production and harvest costs of \$27 per ton. However, the producer putting up 750 tons would have costs of \$15 per ton. The most economical production level is reached at 2,000 tons per year.
