WIMBLEDON, England (AP) — Defending champion Bjorn Borg and former champion Jimmy Connors continue on their collision course today after another ex-Wimbledon champion, Arthur Ashe, and a youngster with a rosy future both

crashed. Last year, 19-year-old John McEnroe had to pre-qualify and shocked the tennis world by reaching the semifinals. This year things were different as the youngster, in only his second week as a tennis professional, lost to Erik Van Dillen, a 26-year-old Californian better known as a doubles player.

Another American teen-age star, 15-year-old Tracy Austin. also discovered how difficult life can be when you are expected to do well. She took
