Kuemper routs Carroll in 3 SPORT GLANCES

Kuemper routed Carroll 12-0 in three innings here Thursday night that saw the Knights bang out nine hits. The Tigers' defense didn't help as Tim Ryan's team was guilty of eight errors. Jeff Kruse was the winning pitcher in upping his mark to 2-0 on the year and extending his shutout innings to 10. Kruse allowed just one hit, a bunt single down the third base line by Roger Bock in the third. Carroll's only other base runner was Jason Sanford on a walk, also in the third.

The Knights, who travel to Ogden tonight for a 6 p.m. varsity tilt, got five runs in the first, three in the second and four in the third.

Kruse helped himself in the first with a two-run triple to right center. Other hits in the inning were by Paul Baldus, Rich Berg and Mike Harman.

In the second, Kruse delivered a run-scoring single and Scott Irlbeck got a two-run single.

The Knights' Kirk Lengeling led off the third frame by hitting an inside-the-park home run to right center to make it 9-0.

Baldus then singled and came home two outs later on a single to left by Jeff Tiefenthaler.

Tiefenthaler then scored on an error to make it 11-0 and after Irlbeck walked, Mike Harman lifted a fly ball to left that Scott Forbes couldn't handle and Kruse raced home to end the game.

Kuemper is now 5-2 on the season, while Carroll slips to 1-3. Carroll hosts Lake City in a Midwest Conference game tonight at 8 p.m.

NBA draft opened today; owners search for Jabbars

NEW YORK (AP) — National Basketball Association club owners searched for the new Jabbars today as the player draft opened at NBA headquarters here.

The NBA draft lasted eight rounds last year. Of the players chosen below the first two rounds, Indiana's James

Edwards was by far the most successful, but there were others who lasted to make the pro ranks.

Edwards replaced Kareem Abdul-Jabbar at Los Angeles early this past season and did well until Abdul-Jabbar returned to the lineup. Edwards was traded to Indiana, where he's expected to make a major contribution next year.

Robertson, caught on with Atlanta after being dropped by the Lakers.

Phoenix' seventh-round pick, Alvin Scott, played in 81 games and was the club's seventh leading scorer. And Golden State's eighth-round choice, guard Ricky Marsh, was actually a starter for a couple of months despite being the 165th player selected out of a total of 170.

So while the focus of attention in today's draft was naturally on the opening round, more than a few general managers were fantasizing about uncovering a diamond in the rough like Edwards among the unfamiliar names of the lower rounds.

Morley's 66 good for lead in Memphis

MEMPHIS (AP) — Al Geiberger had a twinkle in his eye as he assessed his position. "Well," he said, "I've matched last year's first-round score. Now all I have to do is match last year's second-round score."

"The first part," he admitted, "is the easiest." It was something of an understatement. His par 72 was the same score he fired last year in the opening day of the Danny Thomas-Memphis Golf Classic. In that tournament, however, he followed with a tour record 59 in the second round.

This time he was a distant six shots back of Mike Morley's 66 that set the pace Thursday in the \$250,000 event that was interrupted by a thunderstorm and accompanying tornado warning. Play was held up for almost two hours and the final men in the field finished in darkness on the rain-soaked, 7,249-yard Colonial Country Club course.
