## Edwards' pitching saves Tigers

Carroll's Brad Edwards was called upon twice to pitch in Friday night's Midwest Conference 10-9 victory over Lake City here.

The Tiger right hander left the mound after Carroll led 5-4 after the first three innings.

But reliever Scott Hackett couldn't hold a Carroll lead that ballooned to 10-5 heading into the seventh inning and Edwards was called to pitch again.

After the Eagles had tallied four runs with no outs in the final frame, Edwards fanned the next three batters with a runner on second to preserve the win.

For Edwards, it was his

second win of the year and moved his lifetime pitching mark at Carroll to 8-0.

The Tigers are now 2-1 in conference play and 2-3 overall, heading into a Monday night game at Manning.

The Eagles slip to 1-2 in loop play and 2-2 overall. They will be at Perry Monday night.

Lake City took a 1-0 lead in the top of the first on a home run over the left field fence by Ronnie O'Connor.

The Tigers then grabbed a 2-1 lead in their first on run-scoring singles by Edwards who had three hits and who scored three times and by Duane Onken.

Lake City regained the lead in the second on Nathan

Spencer's two-run triple to left center and the losers made it 4-2 in the top of the third on a homer to left by catcher Dave McCaulley.

Carroll took the lead for good in their third, scoring three times for a 5-4 margin.

After Edwards tripled, he scored on Duane Onken's ground out. Moments later the Tigers got two more runs on a wild pickoff attempt of Jim Molitor at third and on a bad throw by the catcher back to the pitcher after a pitch had been delivered to the plate.

Molitor gave the Tigers some insurance in the fifth with a two-run shot over the left field fence to make it 7-4.

A walk to Dennis Doty and a

costly error gave the Eagles a run in the fifth to cut the deficit to 7-5.

But the Tigers weren't through as a bases loaded walk to Steve O'Connor and a two-run double to left by Tracy Buck made it 10-5 in the sixth.

The Eagles weren't through. Tim Roller's two-run single and an error scored three runs early in the seventh. The losers' final run came on a single by Doty. Then Edwards put out the fire.

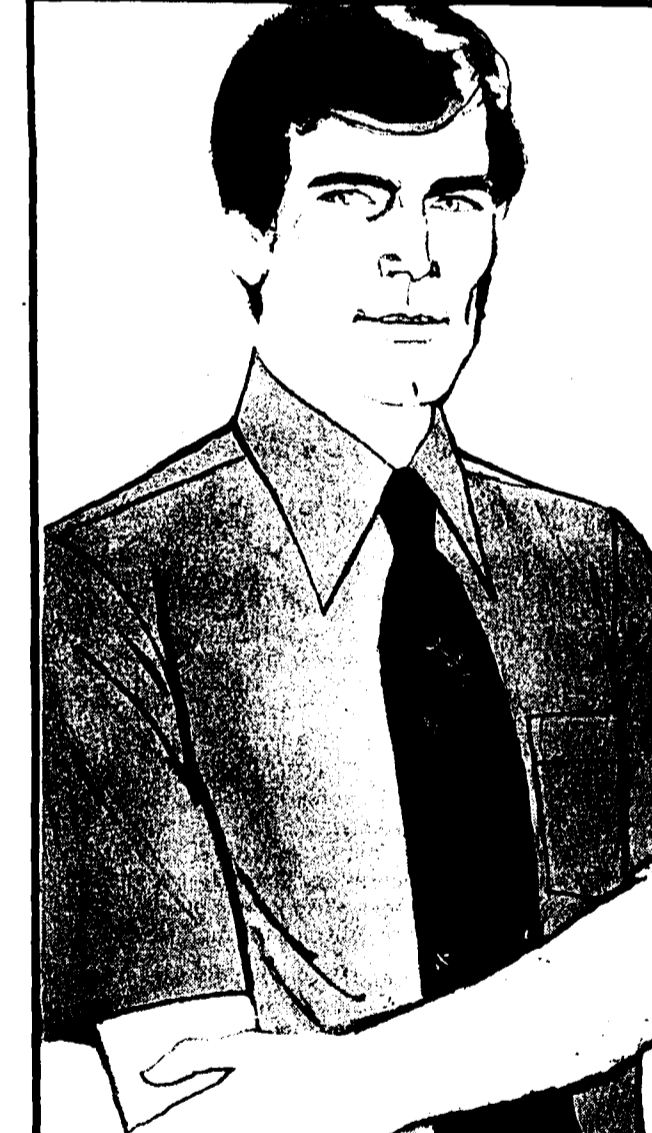

## Could have storybook final at mid-point of World Cup

**BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP)** — The World Soccer Cup could not have worked out better if it had been planned with a crystal ball.

Now at the halfway stage, it is moving steadily toward a storybook final between a European team and a South American team.

Emerging from the complicated structure by which qualifications are decided, four European countries — West Germany, Holland, Italy and Austria — will play in Group A of the second round for a place in the final at Buenos Aires' River Plate Stadium June 25.

Group B consists of three South American teams — Argentina, Brazil and Peru — plus Poland. So only the Poles, who finished third in the last World Cup in 1974, could upset the pattern.

Millions will watch the remaining matches on television screens around the world in the next two weeks. That makes it a very different affair from the inaugural World Cup in Uruguay 48 years ago.

In that tournament, the United States, which did not rate at all as a soccer country,

actually scored the first goal. The marksman was Bart McGhee, whose name went into the game's history books.

Sunday saw the 1,000th goal. It was scored by one of Europe's highly paid superstars, Rob Rensenbrink of Holland, who cracked home a penalty shot in the 34th minute and helped his team into the second round although it lost 3-2 to Scotland.

Argentine firms had offered a stack of prizes for the player who claimed the 1,000th goal. Rensenbrink beat Teofilo Cubillas of Peru to the target by a mere two minutes.

While Holland and Scotland were playing at Mendoza, Peru was beating Iran 4-1 at Cordoba. When the games started, 998 goals had been scored. Peru got a quick one, and that made it 999.

In the 34th minute at Mendoza, the Dutch were awarded a penalty, and Rensenbrink stroked the ball home and hit the jackpot. Two minutes later, Peru had a penalty at Cordoba, and it was Cubillas' turn.

Rensenbrink and Cubillas are rivals in another race, leading the over-all scoring in the tournament. Cubillas has

scored five goals and Rensenbrink four. The all-time World Cup record is 13 by Just Fontaine of France in the 1958 tournament in Sweden.

Brazil, a three-time winner of the Cup, redeemed its reputation by defeating Austria 1-0 at Mar del Plata.

The Brazilians had been in danger of elimination. They won this game with a goal by Roberto in the 75th minute — one that recalled the glories of Pele and Garrincha and other Brazilian stars of the past.

Another of the day's great goals was scored by Archie Gemmill of Scotland, but it was in an effort that failed. The Scots needed to beat Holland by three goals to qualify for the second round. They came back from an 0-1 deficit, and Gemmill's a solo run, in which he wove past three opponents before shooting, gave them a 3-1 lead.
