## Carroll and Lake City post sectional wins

Carroll and Lake City posted sectional high school baseball victories Wednesday night at Carroll Stadium.

Carroll built up a 5-0 advantage in the first four innings and ousted Glidden-Ralston, 9-3, and Lake City scored seven runs in the first two innings and whipped Ar-We-Va, 8-2.

Carroll and Lake City will now play Friday night in the semi-finals at 8 p. m. The winner will advance to the final Monday at 8 p. m. at Carroll Stadium.

It will be the third meeting between the two clubs. The Tigers outlasted the Eagles, 10-9, and Andy McGaffin's club beat Carroll, 5-3, in their last encounter.

**Carroll Game**  
Scott Hackett scattered five hits and struck out seven in picking up his second win of the year.

Carroll grabbed a 3-0 lead in the second as Jim Molitor singled and eventually scored on a sharp single to center by Scott Forbes. A pair of walks loaded the bases then Roger Bock drilled a two-run single.

In the Tiger third, Brad Edwards walked, stole second, went to third on a ground out and tallied on Duane Onken's single to center.

Carroll, now 6-14, made it 5-0 in the fourth as Tracy Buck was safe at home when the Glidden-Ralston pitcher couldn't hold on to the ball.

The Wildcats scored three unearned runs in the sixth to

make it 5-3.  
Randy Schon led off with a single. Mike Blackley then was safe on a fielder's choice. Both scored later on pass balls. After Steve Bock reached on an error, he later scored on another pass ball.

Carroll used three Wildcat errors, two walks and a single by pinch-hitter Steve O'Connor to wrap the game up with four runs in the sixth.

Glidden-Ralston, which tied for second-place in the Central Valley Conference, closes the season at 10-9.

**Lake City Game**  
Craig Rock hurled a three-hitter and fanned six in the Eagles win.

Three Rocket errors opened

the gates early for Lake City as they scored four times in the opening inning on just two hits, a double by Dave McCaulley and a single by Rock.

A double by Mark Conrad started a three-run second Eagle inning.

Lake City, now 13-4 on the season, got their final run in the third on a run-scoring single by Nathan Spencer.

Ar-We-Va, which finishes at 4-8, got a run in the third as losing pitcher Tim Luft was safe at home on a ground ball.

An error, a stolen base and a run-scoring single by Bill Herrig gave the losers their other run in the sixth.

Stephenson, who appeared in one game for the Orioles last September and had previous major league experience with the Chicago Cubs and Milwaukee Brewers, was expected to report in time for tonight's game against Minnesota.

He will fill the vacancy on the Baltimore roster created Wednesday when pitcher Nelson Briles was placed on the 21-day disabled list, retroactive to July 6.

The 34-year-old Briles, with a 2-4 record this season, pulled a muscle in his right calf on July 1 and aggravated the injury July 5.

Stephenson had a 5-4 record and an earned run average of 3.61 in 30 appearances with Rochester.
