Linus Goblirsch Electrostatic spraying equip-

ment could help farmers do a better job of applying postemergence pesticide sprays and save them money, according to Ed Law. University of Georgia ag engineer. The equipment isn't ready yet. but the basic research and development has been completed and patented. Law says his patented system overcomes the problems of earlier electrostatic machines, giving consistent results. He uses an electrostatic induction to charge the spray drops. Air tran-sports the charged drops to the plants. The U of G engineer says his field tests indicate that producers can control insects by applying half the recommended pesticide rate in one gallon of water per acre, and that will save you money. The system appears to be adaptable to areas other than row crop spraying, too, and he is looking into orchard spraying, hoping to develop a system for use in that area.
