

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) -Whatever kind of defense the Seattle SuperSonics were using, legal or illegal, it certainly was effective.

Badgering Washington with traps and double teamming --a tactic which some of the Bullets said merely masked an illegal zone — the SuperSonics scored a 92-82 victory Thursday night and evened the National Basketball Association's championship series at 1-1.

The next two games of the best-of-seven series will be played in Seattle, at the Kingdome on Sunday and at the Coliseum Tuesday night, with the SuperSonics now claiming the homecourt advantage.


