

Walks costly to Tigers as Audubon triumphs in five

AUDUBON—Walks were costly here Monday night as Audubon downed Carroll, 10-0, in five innings in a Midwest Conference game.

The Wheelers took advantage of walks in the first two frames to score nine runs and then ended the contest with a run in the fifth.

Audubon improved their loop record to 4-1, while the Tigers dropped to 0-5 and 0-11 on the season.

In the first, the Wheelers scored three times as the first four batters walked. Then Tracy Wellendorf and Tony Shima delivered run-scoring singles.

In the second, Audubon scored six more times as the first two batters walked. Then Jim Weeks doubled, followed by singles by Todd Williamson and Mike Chambers. An error brought in another run.

George Paris threw a two-hitter for the Wheelers. The only Carroll hits were by Roger Bock and Scott Hackett.

Carroll will host Perry Wednesday night, starting with a junior varsity game at 6 p.m.

Watson says he had no excuses in U.S. Open

IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) — Tom Watson, the leading money winner on the pro golf tour this year, said Monday he had "no excuses for his poor performance in the U.S. Open last week.

Watson, who shot a six-under par 66 at the Amana VIP pro-am tournament here Monday, failed to make the cut at the Open. After shooting rounds of 75 and 77 for a ten-over par 152, Watson failed to qualify for the final two rounds of the Open.

"I just didn't play very well last week. I have no excuses," Watson said. "I didn't have a whole lot of confidence going in and when you don't have confidence going into the U.S. Open you don't play very well."

Asked how he could lack confidence when he already has won more than \$350,000 on the tour this year, Watson replied, "This game

fluctuates. Sometimes it's not so good, sometimes it is. If it's good all the time it wouldn't be any fun."

Watson has been regarded as the top player on the tour the past two years. He was named player of the year after winning \$362,000 in 1978 and this year he has won the Heritage Classic, Tournament of Champions and Byron Nelson Classic.

Watson was in the featured group in Monday's tournament, which was played in cool, windy conditions and was sprinkled by rain at times. His playing partners were former President Gerald R. Ford, baseball Hall of Famer Ernie Banks, former Iowa football coach Forest Evashevski and George Foerster, president of the sponsoring Amana Refrigeration, Inc. Ford, playing in his second

VIP, said he had a "delightful time." The former president said he had six or seven pars and finished at "about 86."

"I played well except for the 13th waterhole," Ford said. "I was more in the water than on the green on that one. I shot a 40 on the front nine, but then I had a little trouble on the water hole."

Ford hit a spectator with a shot at last year's VIP, but avoided that this time. Prior to teeing off he told the gallery he was thankful for the support he received from Iowa in the 1976 election, when he carried the state in his loss to Jimmy Carter.

"Let me express my deep gratitude for the kindness and support of the people of Iowa a couple of years ago when we had a little contest in a different arena."

Proceeds from the tournament are donated to the athletic scholarship fund at the U of

I. With that in mind, Evashevski quipped before teeing off that the tournament is played for a "worthwhile cause and that's to put money in the coffers to have (current Iowa football coach) Hayden Fry go to the Rose Bowl in five years."

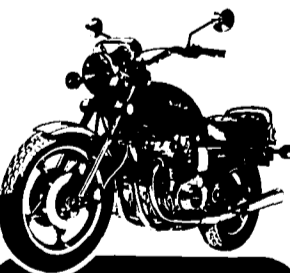
