## Glance and Smith hold key for U.S.

**SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP)** — Harvey Glance and Willie Smith, two speedsters from Alabama, hold the key to the United States' chances of regaining its overwhelming superiority in the Pan-American Games, which open officially here Sunday.

Glance of Phenix City, Ala., will be up against Silvio Leonard of Cuba, the favorite in the

100-meter dash. Smith of Auburn, Ala., will try to defeat Cuba's Alberto Juantorena in the 400 meters. Juantorena, who won both the 400 and 800 meters in the 1976 Montreal Olympics, split two races with Smith earlier this year.

They will be just four of the 5,500 athletes to compete in the largest Pan-American Games, a two-week event,

staged every four years. Athletes representing 34 countries, all from the Western Hemisphere, will compete.

The United States and Cuba are expected to dominate.

Tough competition is also expected in the team sports — basketball, baseball and volleyball.
