Olympic bronze medalist wrestler who died Saturday
night.
Taylor. who wrestled mos of his collegiate career at ove 400 pounds. gained national acclaim as an outstanding wrestler and world-wide controversial loss in the 1972 Olympics.
He came to lowa State Uni-
Dowagiac. Mich from Muskegon Junior College. Word spread quickly through the college wrestling ranks that found an enormous and probably unbeatable heavy-
weight. Nichols had. Taylor never lost a collegeiate match in his His record at ISU was $87-0$. and he won 80 of those matches by falls.
His real problem was his by 10 to 15 pounds in a day. He sometimes dropped 15 pounds in a practice session.
