Tigers can't hold 11-9 lead as Monarchs take loop opener

Carroll and Denison opened up their Midwest Conference baseball season here Wednesday night with the Monarchs coming from behind to take a 17-14 decision. The Tigers, now 0-4 overall, took a 11-9 lead into the seventh, but Jim Nurse's Monarchs tallied eight times. The big blows by Denison were a three-run triple by Tom Koch who finished the

night with five rbi's and a three-run homer to left by designated hitter Steve Wiebers. The Tigers, who will take on the fourth-rated Knights of Kuemper tonight, didn't give up and tallied three times in their seventh on hits by Chris Wilkins, Roger Bock and Duane Onken. Onken had a perfect night. He went four-for-four,

including a double and drove in four runs. Losing pitcher Bock also had a good hitting game. He had two hits and drove in three. Jason Sanford also had two hits and Keith Petersen and Scott Hackett added two runs batted in. After the two teams had battled through a 4-4 tie after three innings, the Monarchs scored five runs in the fourth for a 9-4 bulge, but Carroll

came back with seven runs in the fifth. In that big Tiger frame, Onken led off with a walk, Sanford then singled and Scott Frobes walked to load the bases. Petersen then walked to force in the first tally and then with one out, Hackett delivered a pinch-hit two-run single. After John Dirx walked to load the bases, Bock knocked

in two runs with a single to tie it at nine. Onken then batting again in the inning, delivered a two-run single for the 11-9 lead. Carroll got its early runs with one in the first as Dirx scored on a single by Onken. In the second, two Tiger runs came home on a fielder's choice by Tracy Buck. Sanford and Forbes had singled in the inning. Forbes' ground out in the third scored Bock from third to tie it at four. "We didn't lay down. I'm extremely proud of the way the kids came back," Tiger coach Rich Stoffers said. "It was an excellent team effort. We don't have any quitters on the club and we may have gotten over the hump." Carroll, after meeting Kuemper tonight, will travel to Lake View-Auburn for an 8 p.m. game Friday night.
