Breda rolls on Buel's four-hitter

Carroll's Peterson fires no-hitter at Manilla, 3-0

Carroll's Paul Peterson fired a no-hitter here Wednesday night against Coon Valley champion Manilla as the Tigers won 3-0 to advance to semi-final round Class A sectional play here Friday night against St. Bernard of Breda. Game time will be 8 p.m.

In the opener, Breda advanced with a 9-1 win over Glidden-Ralston as Mark Buel tossed a four-hitter.

Peterson, who will be a junior in the fall, struck out six and walked eight as the Tigers ran their mark to 5-18.

Peterson's only serious

trouble was in the seventh as he walked lead off batter Laren Waterbury. After striking out Tim Ewoldt, Tim Graeve walked.

Brian Ertz then hit into a fielder's choice for the second out, but then Peterson walked Phil Stracke to load the bases.

The Tiger right hander got out of the jam as the next hitter, Mike McMahon, hit a grounder to shortstop Keith Peterson who threw to Jim White at third for a force out to end the game.

The Tigers had trouble with Manilla southpaw Kenny Buck who also pitched a fine game, giving up two hits and fanning 13.

Carroll used three Hawks errors to score all of their runs in the third inning.

John Dirx led off by walking, but was then caught in a rundown between first and second. He made it safe to second as there was a bad throw.

Jim White then laid down a bunt single to put runners at first and third. Roger Bock then reached on an error and Dirx came home. White scored the second run on a pass ball and the final home came home as Duane Onken reached on an error.

"Our strategy in the tournaments was hopefully to keep Scott Hackett fresh for

Friday night," Carroll coach Rich Stoffers said. "We were able to do that because Paul (Peterson) pitched the best game of his life."

"I'm hoping the Carroll crowd comes out and supports us Friday night," added Stoffers. "It's our most important game of the year."

Friday's game will be the Tigers' third meeting with Breda. The Bobcats have won the first two, 10-6, and 11-10.

Breda Game

Dale Leslie's Bobcats jumped out to a quick lead and were never in serious trouble as they won for the 19th time in 25 games.

Breda got a run in the opening frame as leadoff

batter Kenny Kennebeck doubled off the left field fence and later scored on a pass ball.

In the second, the Bobcats made it 4-0 off of Wildcat pitcher Mark Danner as Dave Heisterkamp's three-run double was the big blow.

The Wildcats, who finish at 8-11, made it 4-1 in the fifth as Steve Bock singled with one out and eventually scored with two outs on Duane Owen's single to left.

Breda upped their lead to 5-1 in the sixth as Ken Koster, who went three-for-four, singled down the right field line to score Dan Dirx who had singled earlier.

The Bobcats padded their

victory margin with four runs in the final frame using four walks and two errors.

LAKE CITY — Kathy Finley slammed a solo home run in the bottom of the fifth inning here Wednesday night to give the Eaglettes a 3-2 victory over Carroll in girls softball play.

Finley also drove in Lake City's second run in the second inning with a single that scored Beth Clark. The winners got their first run in the opening frame on a walk, two hits and an error.

The Tigerettes, who dropped their second straight one-run game, tallied twice in the fifth as Janie Petersen walked with the bases loaded to score Rhonda Wittrock. Then Lori Norgaard singled in the tying run. Her hit scored Julie Dostal who had also

singled.

Both pitchers pitched well. Sarah McCrea of Lake City and Carroll's Debbie Watts each gave up only five hits.

"Once again we played well defensively," Tigerette coach Lees Dettbarn said. "Losing two consecutive games by one run is rough, but we have been playing good softball."

Douglass signs with Oaks

CHICAGO (AP) — Rifle-armed Bobby Douglass figures control will be his immediate problem, and that could be a problem for batters, too.

That's right: batters. Not receivers.

The 10-year veteran of quarterbacking in the National Football League has been signed by the Chicago White Sox of the American League and sent to the Iowa Oaks of the American Association.

The Sox — run by stunt-loving Bill Veck — insist the 32-year-old southpaw has big-league potential even though he hasn't played baseball since his college days.

"This is not a gimmick," Roland Hemond, Sox vice president, said Wednesday. "If his name was not Bobby Douglass and you saw him pitch, you'd say, 'You've got to sign this guy.' So that's what we did."

"We signed him as a major league prospect," Hemond said. "What he does in Iowa will dictate what happens."

Douglass has been throwing batting practice for the White Sox and the Chicago Cubs recently. He is to report to the Des Moines team Friday and probably will be used initially in relief, Hemond said.
