WIMBLEDON, England (AP) - Bjorn Borg of Sweden made modern tennis history by beating Roscoe Tanner 6-7, 6-1, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4 to win the Wimbledon men's singles title for the fourth year in a row a feat achieved by no other man since 1913.

Billie Jean King also was a record setter, winning her 20th Wimbledon championship with a victory in the women's doubles. She teamed with Martina Navratilova to beat Wendy Turnbull and Betty Stove 5-7, 6-3, 6-2.

King went into the doubles final tied at 19 championships with Eliabeth "Bunny" Ryan, 88, who died at Wimbledon Friday after watching Navratilova win the singles points and 10 bull's-eyes.

The incidence of brucellosis is relatively small in the U.S. with only about one half of one percent infected.
