Carroll and Breda score Class A sectional victories

Carroll and St. Bernard of Breda came through Monday night with opening round Class A sectional tournament baseball wins at Carroll Stadium.

The Tigers turned back scrappy Ar-We-Va, 7-4, and Breda ousted Manning, 10-2.

In second round play Wednesday night at Carroll Stadium, Breda will go against Glidden-Ralston at 6 p. m. and Carroll will face Manila at 8 p. m.

Carroll Game
The Tigers, in winning their fourth game of the season, built up a 4-0 lead into the bottom of the sixth inning, but Ar-We-Va fought back and closed the gap to 4-3 entering

the seventh. Carroll, now 4-18, got three runs in the seventh for insurance.

Ar-We-Va pitcher Tim Luft had some tough luck as he battled Paul Peterson threw four scoreless frames.

With two out in the fifth, Carroll scored three times, thanks to two fly balls that were lost in the lights by Rocket outfielders.

Chris Wilkins got the fifth going for Rich Stoffers' club with a walk. Duane Onken then hit a fly ball that was lost in the lights and it turned into a triple, scoring Wilkins for a 1-0 lead. Hackett then lofted a fly to center that went for a triple and it was 2-0. On Hackett's hit, he came around to score on an overthrow.

In the sixth inning, Roger Bock drilled a double to left with one out. He then scored as Luft's throw on a pickoff attempt went into center.

The Tigers' Paul Peterson, who pitched well until tiring, got the win with relief help from Hackett.

The Rocketts, who close at 1-9, started their scoring in the sixth as Luft walked. Roger Liechti then blooped a double to right. Bill Herrig then followed with a two-run double to left.

Stoffers, who played his high school ball at Ar-We-Va, then brought in Hackett who promptly threw two wild pitches to score Herrig to make it 4-3.

Three walks, three errors, two of them on overthrows,

accounted for the Tigers' runs in the seventh.

Ar-We-Va got their final run of the season in the seventh as Don Finch walked and eventually scored on a wild pitch.

Breda Game

Dale Leslie's Bobcats rode the five-hit pitching of Andy Kennebeck and some timely hitting in racking up their 18th win against six losses.

Andy Kennebeck, who struck out five in upping his mark to 7-3, helped Breda get started by slamming a two-run triple in the first.

Dave Heisterkamp got Breda off to the three-run first as he singled with one out. After Mark Buelt walked, Andy Kennebeck slammed his triple. Brian Neiland then

followed with a run-scoring single.

Breda made it 4-0 in the top of the third as Andy Kennebeck walked and eventually scored on a wild pitch.

The Bulldogs, who finish at 9-8, made it 4-1 in their third as Jeff Potthoff's singled home Dave Ramsey.

In the fifth, Breda upped their margin to 5-1 as Neiland singled and scored on three pass balls.

Manning cut it to 5-2 in the sixth as Jon Hagedorn's ground out scored losing pitcher Keith Wanninger.

Wanninger had control problems as he walked five. He struck out 12, but five errors didn't help him, especially in the seventh.

In the seventh, Breda scored five times with the help of three Bulldog miscues.

Dan Dirxx got a rbi single for the Bobcats' first run and then Kenny Kennebeck doubled home three runs. As he was trying to stretch his hit into a triple, the ball got by the Manning third baseman and Kennebeck came home with the final run of the game.

the winner. Carroll, which finishes at 2-10 in conference play, tied it in the fifth as Rhonda Wittrock and Janie Petersen walked. Lori Norgaard then singled home Wittrock.

Perry, now 10-1 and who plays second-place Manning tonight, scored their only other run in the first as Debbie Watts walked four straight
