Kuemper in Carroll Invitational final

Defending champion Kuemper and St. Edmond of Fort Dodge will play in the championship game of the Carroll Invitational baseball tournament.

The title game was scheduled for 7:30 p. m. Sunday night, but a thunderstorm, accompanied by pea-sized hail, wiped that out. It will be played at a later date.

Kuemper advanced to the final by blanking Audubon, 8-0, Sunday afternoon. On Saturday, they shutout Coon Rapids by the same score.

St. Edmond whipped Scranton on Sunday, 13-0, in five innings. On Saturday, the Gaels turned back Midwest Conference rival Denison, 10-6.

In two other first round games which had interesting highlights, Scranton outslugged or outscored Lake View-Auburn, 38-25, and in a

game that started Saturday night and finished Sunday afternoon, Audubon outlasted Carroll, 14-13.

The Scranton-Lake View-Auburn game started at 1 p. m. Saturday, but didn't get over until 4:35 p. m.

The length of that game set everything back since St. Edmond and Denison were set to play at 3 p. m.

In the final game Saturday, Carroll and Audubon started play at 9:50 p. m. The game was suspended at 12:03 a. m. Sunday morning with the Wheelers ahead by one, 12-11.

The reason for the suspension according to Carroll High School Athletic Director Al Molitor was that two towers of lights dimmed way down and one of the towers had a fire.

The Carroll-Audubon game was resumed at 11:15 a. m. Sunday morning and was finished 55 minutes later at

12:10 p. m. The tournament was definitely an offensive show except for the two fine shutouts registered by Kuemper pitchers.

In the six games, 135 runs were scored and there were 101 hits.

Kuemper-Audubon Jeff Hinners and Dale Oswald combined to fire a two-hitter at Bill Henkenius' Wheelers.

Hinners went the first three innings and didn't allow a hit. Oswald, now 2-0 on the season, went the final four and struck out three. Oswald also helped himself at the plate by delivering a two-run single.

Kuemper took a 1-0 lead in the third as Dean Steinkamp walked, stole second and scored on an error.

The Knights, now 6-3 on the season, made it 3-0 in the fourth as Russ Nieland reached on an error, stole

and scored later on a double down the left field line by Hinners. Hinners then came home when a fly ball was dropped in right.

Kuemper got four runs in the fifth as Oswald had a two-run hit. Steinkamp followed that up by also delivering a two-run single.

In the final inning, Tom Berg led off with a triple and two outs later, Jon Heisterkamp's infield single brought in the run.

Kuemper-Coon Rapids Steinkamp fired a two-hitter and struck out 14 as the sophomore got his second victory. He walked eight.

The Knights jumped to a 2-0 lead in the second against the Crusaders as Steve Loneman walked and stole second. Scott Cawley then singled to put runners at the corners. Steve Nurse then banded a double to drive in the first run and the second run scored on a wild

pitch. In the third, Kuemper upped their lead to 4-0, as Jim Ericson walked with one out. He stole second and came home on a single by Cawley. Cawley later scored on a pass ball.

Kuemper got single runs in the fourth and sixth. In the fourth, Steinkamp walked and later scored on an error. In the sixth, Oswald singled with one out, stole second and later scored on an error.

In the seventh, the Knights got their final two runs as pinch hitter Russ Tigges hit an inside-the-park home run to center.

Then with two outs, Heisterkamp walked, stole second and scored on a single by Steinkamp.

Carroll-Audubon Warren Rudkin's Carroll team spotted Audubon seven runs in the first inning, came back, but fell just short. The Wheelers got only one

earned run in the first inning as the Tigers committed five errors. For the game, Carroll had eight errors and out-hit the winners, 12 to 5.

Scott Steffen was the big offensive show for Carroll as he had four hits, including a double.

Getting two hits each were Roger Bock, Jim White, Paul Peterson and Rex Mitchell. Bock, White and Peterson also had doubles.

Carroll is now 3-4 on the season, heading into a road game tonight at Jefferson.

One-hitter for Tigers' Peterson

Carroll's Paul Peterson came within one out of throwing a no-hitter for the second time in his career Friday night here as the Tigers blanked Manning, 10-0, in five innings in a Midwest Conference game.

Peterson, who had a no-hit gem two seasons ago against Manila, allowed only a single to right by Kevin Klocke that came with two outs in the top of the fifth inning. For the game, Peterson struck out seven and walked only two. It was an important win for

new Tiger coach Warren Rudkin, his assistant Steve Kayser and the players.

They are now 1-1 in conference play and it marked the team's third win of the season. Last year Carroll won only three games, while dropping 19.

Roger Bock and Todd Holm led the way for the Tigers in batting. Bock had two hits, including a double. He also drove in two runs and scored twice. Holm, who scored once, had a single and a double, good for three rbis.

The Tigers got all the runs they needed in the third inning when they tallied six times.

Chris Wilkins led off with a walk. After Scott Steffen singled, Bock later banded a two-run double to left center.

Jim White then singled home Bock to make it 3-0. After Peterson singled, there was a double steal, putting runners at second and third. Holm then delivered a two-run double. Holm later came home on an error.

Carroll got their other four runs in the fourth as Bock

slammed a triple to right center to make it 7-0. He later scored on an error. Peterson, who reached on an error, scored later on another error and the final run came home on a single by Holm that chased in Rex Mitchell.

JV Game Manning won the junior varsity game, 6-4, in five innings.

"The kids are playing better," Carroll coach Kayser said. "They're improving." The Tigers' junior varsity mark is now 2-3.




