They both moved up on steals and came home later on throwing errors. Julie Dostal got the other run as she walked, stole second and later scored on a wild pitch.

Carroll made it 4-1 in the

third as Beth Blohm reached on an error and later scored on a wild pitch.

The Tigerettes got three runs in the fifth for a 7-2 cushion as Nancy Heffernan and Petersen singled. Norgaard then singled to load the bases. Blohm then followed with a fielder's choice for one run and then Dostal and Darla Deen drove in runs with singles.

Carroll added their final two tallies in the seventh as Christy Griffith reached on a fielder's choice and Kim

Wenck walked. Both scored later on an error.

"Our defense was the key to winning the game," Stoffers said. "Our young kids are coming along and we're gaining confidence in our defensive play."

"Freshman Darla Deen had a good fielding night with five assists and three putouts," Stoffers said.

two hits, had a single in the fifth.

winning pitcher Ed Vanderheiden who scattered five hits and fanned seven.

Shawn Detman's ground out scored Tim Helmbrecht with the first run and then Dan Peyton singled in Kevin Scharn with the second run.

However, the Tigers came right back in their third with two runs as Tony Puffett's bloop single to center scored Rex Mitchell who tripped over the left fielder's head. Puffett later scored on a wild pitch.

Lytton got a run in the fourth as Scott Matter and

Helmbrecht singled. Matter later scored on an error.

The Tigers got four runs in the fourth, thanks to two errors, five walks and two wild pitches.

Lytton got their final two tallies in the fifth with the help of two Carroll miscues.

The Tigers now take on Kuemper Friday night, starting with the junior varsity game at 6 p. m.

Lytton is now 0-3 on the season.
