Kuemper girls snap Tigerettes' streak, 8-6

The Kuemper girls used two innings to score most of their runs and snapped Carroll's unbeaten streak of three games, 8-6, here Friday night in softball action.

The Lady Knights, now 3-2 on the year and winners of two straight, took a 3-0 lead in the third, but Carroll came back in their half of the frame with two runs.

After both teams got a run in the fourth, Kuemper grabbed an 8-3 lead in the top of the sixth and then held off the Tigerettes.

Betty Seidl's two-run single put Kuemper on top at 2-0 and then Donna Staples made it 3-0 with a run-scoring single. Carroll's Jane Petersen and

Lori Norgaard walked in their third and came home with the help of two Lady Knight errors.

In the fourth, Kuemper got their run as Karen Berg slammed a home run to left.

Carroll countered as losing pitcher Angie Nobiling walked. After Kim Wenck singled and Petersen walked, Norgaard walked to force in Nobiling.

Kuemper's four-run sixth was highlighted by Cheryl Nieland who had a rbi triple; winning pitcher Joni Huegerich who had a rbi single; and Shelly Naughton who had a two-run homer.

Carroll got two runs in their sixth as Petersen singled and

Norgaard doubled. Then Julie Dostal and Christy Griffith came through with run-scoring singles.

Carroll got a run in the seventh as Kim Wenck walked and then Norgaard singled. Wenck later scored on a wild pitch.

"What did it for us was our aggressiveness on the bases and hustle," Kuemper coach Tim Fitzpatrick said. "Also, everybody helped out and we got a lot of timely hits."

"The key to the game was us leaving 13 runners on base, but we have to remember that we have a lot of young kids," Carroll coach Lisa Stoffers said.

"I'm really proud with the

way the team played because it was a good, competitive game in which either team could have won," Stoffers added.

Kuemper hosts Fort Dodge tonight, starting with a jv game at 6 p. m.

Carroll, now 3-1, travels to Denison tonight, starting with a jv game at 6 p. m.

Kuemper won the junior varsity game from the Tigerettes, 25-5, in four innings to slip their mark to 2-0. Carroll slipped to 0-4.

8-run fourth sends Kuemper past Tigers

Kuemper broke open a tight game with eight runs in the fourth inning and went on to a 12-2 victory in five innings over rival Carroll Friday night.

The Tigers' Paul Peterson was doing a good job on the mound through the first three frames, but then the roof caved in on him and his teammates.

The Knights sent 11 men to

the plate in the fourth inning, using five walks and four hits to do the damage.

Sophomore Dean Steinkamp, who was perfect on the night, gave Kuemper a 4-0 bulge with a two-run single that drove in Mike Brincks and pinch runner Dale Oswald.

Tom Berg made it 5-0 as he scored on a wild pitch. Steve Loneman's two-run bloop single to center made it 7-0 and then Steve Nurse raced

home on a wild pitch.

Loneman came home on a Peterson balk for a 9-0 lead and the final run came home as Brincks scored on a wild pitch.

Kuemper took a 1-0 lead in the second as Brincks, who also was perfect at the plate, singled down the left field line to score Loneman.

The Knights made it 2-0 in the third as Scott Cawley's single to left chased home

Steinkamp.

Carroll got on the board in the top of the fifth as three walks loaded the bases and then Peterson blooped a single to center to score Roger Bock and Gary Benedict.

Knight hurler Jeff Hinners, who scattered five hits and struck out five, then closed the door.

Kuemper finished the game in their half of the fifth as Jim Ericson singled to center to score Hinners and then Keith Irlmeier walked to force in John Snyder who had earlier singled in the inning.

Kuemper captured their fourth baseball victory in five starts here Saturday night as junior Mike Brincks hurled the Knights to a 6-1 decision over Missouri Valley.

Brincks, who scattered nine hits and struck out eight, lost his shutout with two outs in the seventh as Mike Cooper came up with his third hit of the game, a double, and later scored on a bloop single to center by Fritz Noren.

The Knights, who will host Storm Lake in a doubleheader Wednesday night, starting at 6 p. m., scored two runs each in the second, third and sixth innings.
