## 2 Denison pitchers no-hit Tigers

It wasn't a very good night for Warren Rudkin's Carroll team in their Midwest Conference opener here Monday.

Two Denison right handers, Stu Marsh and reliever Pat Drennen, combined to pitch a no-hitter as the Monarchs whipped the Tigers, 10-0, in five innings.

Marsh went the first three innings to pick up the victory.

During those innings, Carroll had two base runners, Chris Wilkins led off the game by reaching on an overthrow at first and ended up on third. Then in the second, Gary Benedict walked.

Drennen also allowed two Tiger base runners. Benedict reached on an error in the fourth and Tony Puffett walked with two outs in the fifth.

Denison, now 3-1 overall, got all the runs they needed in

the second as Mike Rowedder, who was two-for-two with three rbi's, singled in Marsh with the first run then later scored on pass balls.

The Monarchs made it 7-0 after three innings as Scott Carritt's double to left made it 4-0. Rowedder then followed later with a two-run triple to deep center to make it 6-0 and the final tally came home on a Jon Wiebers' single to right.

Denison got two runs in the fourth with the help of three Carroll walks, two errors and a single by pinch hitter LeRoy Erps.

The Monarchs ended the contest in the fifth as Bryan Woodward reached on an error and scored later on a wild pitch.

Carroll, now 2-3 overall, will try to get back into the win column when they entertain Manning Friday night, starting with a jv game at 6 p.
