## Puffett scores in 8th to lift Tigers, 3-2

Tony Puffett scored from second base on an infield hit and an over-throw at first base in the bottom of the eighth inning to give Carroll an important 3-2 victory over rival Jefferson here Wednesday night.

Puffett led off the inning by doubling down the right field line. Tim Rotert then hit a slow roller to third base. The third baseman's throw was wild to first, scoring the winning run.

The victory snaps a four-game losing streak and puts the Tigers at 4-4 in the Midwest Conference. Overall, they now stand 6-9, doubling last year's win total.

The win was important for

another reason. Starting centerfielder Chris Wilkins was riding his motorcycle to batting practice earlier in the afternoon. He was involved in an accident with a pickup truck and suffered a broken left arm which will keep him out the rest of the season.

His loss had to fire up his teammates.

Paul Peterson pitched another strong game for Warren Rudkin's club. He scattered seven hits and struck out eight.

The Tigers took a 2-1 lead into the seventh, but the Rams tied it on a two-out double by Jeff Miner that chased home pinch runner Andy Knight.

Jefferson grabbed the first lead of the contest with a run

in the first as Chris Gibson singled home John Donovan who led off the inning with a walk and then stole second.

The Tigers, who play at Manning tonight, then tied the game in the fourth as Rotert's fielder's choice scored Gary Benedict who had led off the inning with a single.

In the fifth the Tigers took a 2-1 lead as Jim White's slow roller to third with the bases loaded couldn't be handled and Roger Bock scored.

Carroll played errorless ball, led by fine defensive plays by right fielder Puffett, third baseman White and shortstop Bob Dirck.

Scott Steffen led the Tigers at the bat with three hits, but none of them figured in the

scoring.

**JV bows**

Jefferson won the junior varsity game, 11-5, in five innings to improve to 10-2 on the year.

The Tigers, who are now 3-10, were led by Bob Dirck and Jay Savery who collected two hits apiece.

Losing pitcher Jay Norgaard wasn't helped in the field as Carroll committed six errors.
