Tug-o-War classic at Dedham

DEDHAM—The Miller High Life Tug-o-War Classic, sponsored by Farner-Bocken of Carroll, will be held here on Sunday, July 12 at the ballpark.

There will be four men's weight classes and two women's with weigh-in at 12 noon and pulling from 2 to 5 p. m.

The men's classes are lightweight (1235 total pounds); middleweight (1410 pounds); heavyweight (1587 pounds); and catchweight (unlimited).

The two women's classes

are lightweight (1105 pounds) and catchweight (unlimited). There will be eight person teams only in both classes.

All the competition will be under the rules of the United States Amateur Tug-o-War Association. The referees will be T. W. I. F. certified and

members of the Quad States Tug-o-War Association. There will be team trophies for the first two-places in each division and 30 Miller mugs to the all-tournament selections. A beer reception will follow after the event for all pullers and spectators.

The entry fee of \$10 per team is due by July 8. If not by then, the entry fee will go to \$20.

Carroll came into the contest with a second-place 5-3 record and 8-5 overall mark.

Lori Willenborg and Jean Wiese were the big hitters for the winners as they each had three hits. Teammate Kim Pfannkuch added three rbi's.

Carroll had four girls with two hits. They were Jane Petersen, Lori Norgaard, Kim Wenck and losing pitcher Angie Nobiling.

Both clubs got off to a roaring start as the game was deadlocked 5-5 after the first inning.

Pfannkuch had the key blow for the Bulldogs, a two-run single.

The Tigerettes' key blows in the opening frame were two-run singles by Christy Griffith and Andrea Farrell and a run-scoring single by Nobiling.

Two errors helped Manning to two runs in the third and a 7-5 lead.

Carroll got a run in the fifth to make it 7-6, but the Bulldogs tallied two runs in the sixth as Pfannkuch and winning pitcher Vickie Miller walked to force in runs.

Norgaard's rbi single in the bottom of the sixth finished out Carroll's scoring.

In the seventh, the Bulldogs

tallied four times, highlighted by runs batted in by Julie Mohr and Wiese.

Carroll hosts St. Edmond Monday night, while Manning travels to Wall Lake tonight.
