## White fans 15 as Tigers down CR, 12-3

Carroll's baseball team upped their season record to 3-1 here Wednesday night, defeating Coon Rapids, 12-3, as Jim White went the distance, allowing just four hits and fanning 15.

The Tigers, who play at Manning Friday night before hosting their own invitational Saturday and Sunday, grabbed a 12-0 lead in the first two innings against the youthful Crusaders who fell to 0-4 on the year.

Then Carroll head coach Tony Weiler subbed freely against Crusader coach Dave Whitver who started three eighth graders, one freshman, two sophomores and two juniors.

The Tigers got five runs in the first off of John McDowell with the big hits being a two-run double by Jeff Beidler

and run-scoring singles by Jay Savery and Steve Petersen.

In the second inning, the Tigers knocked McDowell out of the game with seven runs.

The key blows for Carroll came from Tony Puffett who belted a two-run double, a run-scoring single by Petersen and a two-run single by Jeff Lehman.

Coon Rapids got on the scoreboard with two runs in the third as Keith Jensen reached on an error and went to second on a sacrifice bunt by Bart Tipton. Scott Armstrong then singled to right to score Jensen and then two errors allowed Armstrong to score.

The Crusaders got their other run in the fifth as Armstrong struck out, but reached second on a pass ball. He moved to third on a ground out and came home on an infield hit by Kirby

Joy.

Chris Fine pitched well in relief for Coon Rapids, allowing just three hits in five innings and three runs, but none of them earned.

None of the runs off of White were earned either.

Coon Rapids' next action is also Friday night at YJB of Jamaica.
