# Denison wins rubber game with Kuemper

Denison built up a 5-0 advantage and then held off a late Kuemper bid to post a 5-2 victory over the Knights in the semi-finals of the Kuemper Invitational baseball tournament here Sunday afternoon.

For Denison, they take the rubber game. Earlier this season, the Knights knocked off the Monarchs, 7-4, but then Denison returned the favor with a 4-3 eight inning triumph.

On Saturday afternoon, Kuemper downed rival Carroll, 12-5, breaking open a tight game with five runs in the seventh.

The Monarchs, co-leaders of the Midwest Conference, jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first inning off of Kuemper's Glen Sievers.

Winning pitcher Bryan Woodward doubled down the left field line on the game's first pitch. He later scored on Lee Johannsen's ground out. The second run came home when Gary Mendlik reached on an error.

Denison made it a 4-0 game in the fourth on run-scoring singles by Shawn Kierscht and Pat Drennen.

In the top of the seventh, Jim Nurse's club got an insurance run as Mike Francois led off with a single, went to second on a halk and later scored on

The Knights, now 6-7 heading into a road game Tuesday at Fort Dodge, avoided the shutout with two runs in the bottom of the seventh.



BANK Q. For quite a few years, I've claimed only one exemption for income tax withholding purposes, although I'm legally entitled to four. I usually get a refund which I look upon as extra cash or a bonus. These days, I could certainly use the extra cash now, rather than later. Is it generally a good practice to have an employer take out a

higher amount of withholding tax than necessary? A. When your employer has been authorized (by you) to withhold more than is necessary from your paycheck, you are literally giving the Internal Revenue Service the use of your money, interest-free all year. Your refund never carries an interest payment with it. In most cases, the wiser course is to figure as closely as possible what your tax liability will be, and ask your employer to

withhold only what is necessary, in order to meet that liability. Then, put that extra money to work earning interest, for you in one of several interestearning and available savings accounts.
