## Dirkx sparks Carroll past Manning, 6-5

Jim White singled home Bobby Dirkx from third with no outs in the bottom of the seventh inning here Monday night to give Carroll a 6-5 Midwest Conference triumph over Manning.

The winning run was set up as Dirkx, who was the Tigers' main offensive punch in the game with three hits in four at bats, good for three runs batted in. He singled to start the inning.

Dirkx then went to third as Manning pitcher Jon Hagedorn's pickoff attempt was wild at first.

It was a tough loss for Hagedorn who scattered eight hits, walked two and struck out four. He also helped himself at the plate with two hits and three runs batted in.

Carroll pitcher Kenny Hoffman also was superb. Hoffman went the distance, allowing six hits, walking just

one and fanning 11 batters. Manning, now 0-9 in the conference and 2-9 overall, tied the game in the top of the seventh as Chris Nelson doubled with one out. He went to third on Al Hinners' ground out and came home on an infield hit by Jeff Houghton.

The Tigers, now 2-5 in the league and 6-9 overall, heading into a non-conference game tonight at Scranton, jumped to a 3-0 lead in the second, using four hits.

Jeff Beidler, Tracy Teague and Dan Dreesen hit consecutive singles to center with Dreesen's hit, chasing home Beidler for a 1-0 lead. Then Dirkx ripped a single to center two outs later to drive in two more runs.

Manning didn't play like a team that is winless in the conference. The Bulldogs battled back to tie the game in the third.

Chris Langel led off for the Bulldogs

with a single to right and moved to second on a wild pitch. A walk to Rick Ramsey and an error loaded the bases with one out.

Then Al Hinners reached on an error to make it a 3-1 game and then Hagedorn slammed a two-run single to left to tie it.

Carroll went ahead again in the fourth with two runs. Tracy Teague led off with a walk. Teague went to second on a wild pitch. Then Dreesen got his second single of the night. On the play, Teague overran third and was put out.

Jay Savery then singled to put runners at first and third. Dreesen then scored on a wild pickoff at first. The fifth Tiger run came home on a single to left by Dirkx.

The Bulldogs closed to within 5-4 in the fifth as Al Hinners reached on an error. He then came home on a double to right by Hagedorn.

Manning had a golden opportunity to

score in the fourth as Jim Hinners led off with a triple, but Hoffman got the next two batters on strikes and then got Rick Ramsey on a ground out to end the inning.

The Bulldogs are in action tonight at Manila and then host St. Edmond Wednesday.

After playing Scranton tonight, the Tigers will travel to Jefferson for another Midwest Conference contest Wednesday.
