# Tigers fall to 20-4 Gaels, 5-0,

# and to Lytton, 7-5, over weekend

Carroll's baseball team dropped two games over the long Fourth of July weekend.

The Tigers lost a Midwest Conference home game Monday night to St. Edmond, 5-0. Last Friday night, the Tigers dropped a 7-5 decision at Lytton. Carroll, now 2-7 in conference play and 7-12 overall, plays at Audubon Wednesday night, starting with a junior varsity game at 6 p. m.

### St. Edmond Game

You couldn't fault Tiger pitcher Dan Dreessen who scattered nine hits and allowed just one earned run against a club that now boasts a sparkling 20-4 record.

The Gaels, now 6-3 in the league, got all the runs they needed in the second inning, scoring three times on four hits. They also were helped by a Tiger error.

Todd Ball's bad hop single drove in the Gaels' first run and then winning pitcher Dave Konvalinka's ground out brought home run No. 2. The third run came home on a single by Gordy Baker.

While Dreessen was tough for the Tigers, Konvalinka was tough for the Gaels, allowing just three hits and fanning 10. In one stretch, he fanned five Tigers in a row.

The Gaels made it a 4-0 game in the fourth as Kevin Kommes singled and later scored on an infield hit by Dave Lang

St. Edmond got their final run in the sixth inning as pinch hitter Rick McCarville doubled home Dirk Sandvig who was pinch running for Konvalinka who had singled.

Chris Wilkins got two of the Tigers' three hits and Jay Savery got the other hit.

Carroll's best scoring threats were in the first two frames when they left the bases loaded.

St. Edmond also won the junior var-

sity game, 14-1, in five innings, upping their mark to 11-1-1. Carroll, now 8-6 for the season, got

their lone run in the fifth as Chris Koster singled home losing pitcher Mark DeMey.

Carroll's other hits came from DeMey and Tim Koster, both with singles.

### Lytton Game

Lytton wiped out a 4-2 deficit with five runs in the fifth to edge the Tigers. The Tigers out-hit Lytton, 5 to 3, but Carroll was guilty of six errors.

Three of Carroll's five hits went for extra bases as Steve Petersen and Tracy Teague had doubles and Wilkins a triple.

Carroll's big frame was the fourth, scoring three times on Teague's runscoring double and Petersen's two-run double.

Carroll got a run in the fifth as Tony Puffett's sacrifice fly to left scored Jim White who had walked, advanced to second on a wild pitch and went to third on a stolen base.

The Tigers got their final run in the sixth as Savery walked, stole second, went to third on a wild pitch and scored on an error.

Winning pitcher Bob Kruckenberg's two-run single put Lytton on the board in the fourth.

Lytton's big fifth inning started as Dan Peyton and Shawn Dettman reached on an errors and came home on a two-run double by Arnie Koeppen. Tim Helmbrecht later slammed a two-run triple for the winners and Helmbrecht later came home on a wild pitch by losing pitcher Kenny Hoffman.


