

Carroll sweeps Nevada in baseball

Carroll won a pair of close games with Nevada and swept the Cubs in a Raccoon River Conference double-header Wednesday night.

The Tigers won the first game 4-2.

Tyler Tuel got the win, giving up two earned runs on six hits with one walk and eight strikeouts. Nevada scored both of its runs in the top of the sixth inning.

The Tigers scored one run in the second and three in the fifth. Tuel had a rbi sacrifice fly in the second inning. Derek Major scored on an error, Michael Dirkx plated a run with a sacrifice fly and Addison Patrick stole home for the Tiger's runs in the fifth.

Carroll won the second game 6-5.

Kyle Christensen stroked a grand slam homerun in the third for the Tigers. Kyle Semprini had a rbi single in the fourth.

Jace Christensen got the win in 1 2/3 innings of work, giving up two hits and striking out two. Dirkx pitched the final three innings for the save. He gave up no runs on four hits with three walks and five strikeouts.

Steven Irlbeck started the game on the mound and gave up three earned runs on two hits with two walks and no strikeouts. Taylor Ostrich pitched 2 1/3 innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

"It was nice to see us get a couple wins, we needed them at this point in time," Carroll coach Dirk Troutman said. "We still need to work on some things offensively and defensively. We had some kids step up and pitch on short rest tonight, which was tremendous."
